Botanic Gardens Schools Education Risk Management Guidelines for teachers



To reduce risks to people and plants at Adelaide Botanic Garden please consider the following:

A calm and respectful attitude provides a safe environment for all ages. The Gardens are a shared space.

Behaviour management and safety remains the responsibility of the supervising teacher/s at all times while in the Gardens.

To support teachers and students to have a safe and successful visit, Botanic Gardens Education request the following adult student rations be observed:

Kindergarten – Year 2 1:6 students

Year 3 – Year 71:10 students

Year 8 – Year 12 1:15 students

As the teacher in charge is responsible for the activity, they are not included as part of the supervisory minimum adult to student ratio.

All garden staff including horticulture staff are trained in First Aid.

Botanic Gardens Schools Education – Risk Level Summary

- 1. All risks are minimised when visiting groups provide sufficient supervision of students.
- 2. The supervising teacher is expected to read and understand the Risk Management Guidelines sent before each visit. These guidelines include a requirement for students to walk and stay in groups with a supervising adult when possible and to follow rules for the safety of all people in the garden.

Physical and/or sexual assault	Low-High	 Whole Adelaide Botanic Garden child-safe policy and procedures in place. Staff and volunteer WH&S training including Adelaide Botanic Garden security staff.
Tripping on rough surfaces	Low-High	 Behaviour expectations info pack to teachers - walking not running, stay on paths. Report incidents (PAWS) & rough areas to WHS Coordinator (contact Botanic Gardens administration).
Injury	Low-Med	 Adelaide Botanic Garden staff with First Aid training. Schools to bring own First Aid equipment and staff training.
Slip on wet boardwalk or injuries near viewing areas.	Low-High	 Report incidents (PAWS) to WHS Coordinator (contact Botanic Gardens administration).
Allergy reaction at Adelaide Botanic Garden	Low	 Adelaide Botanic Garden staff with First Aid training. Report suspect plant species to Horticulture & WHS Co-ord (contact Botanic Gardens administration).
Asthma attack.	Low to Ext	 Children with asthma to bring asthma plans and kits to the visit Adelaide Botanic Garden staff with First Aid training.
Water bodies	Low-High	 Close supervision of students
