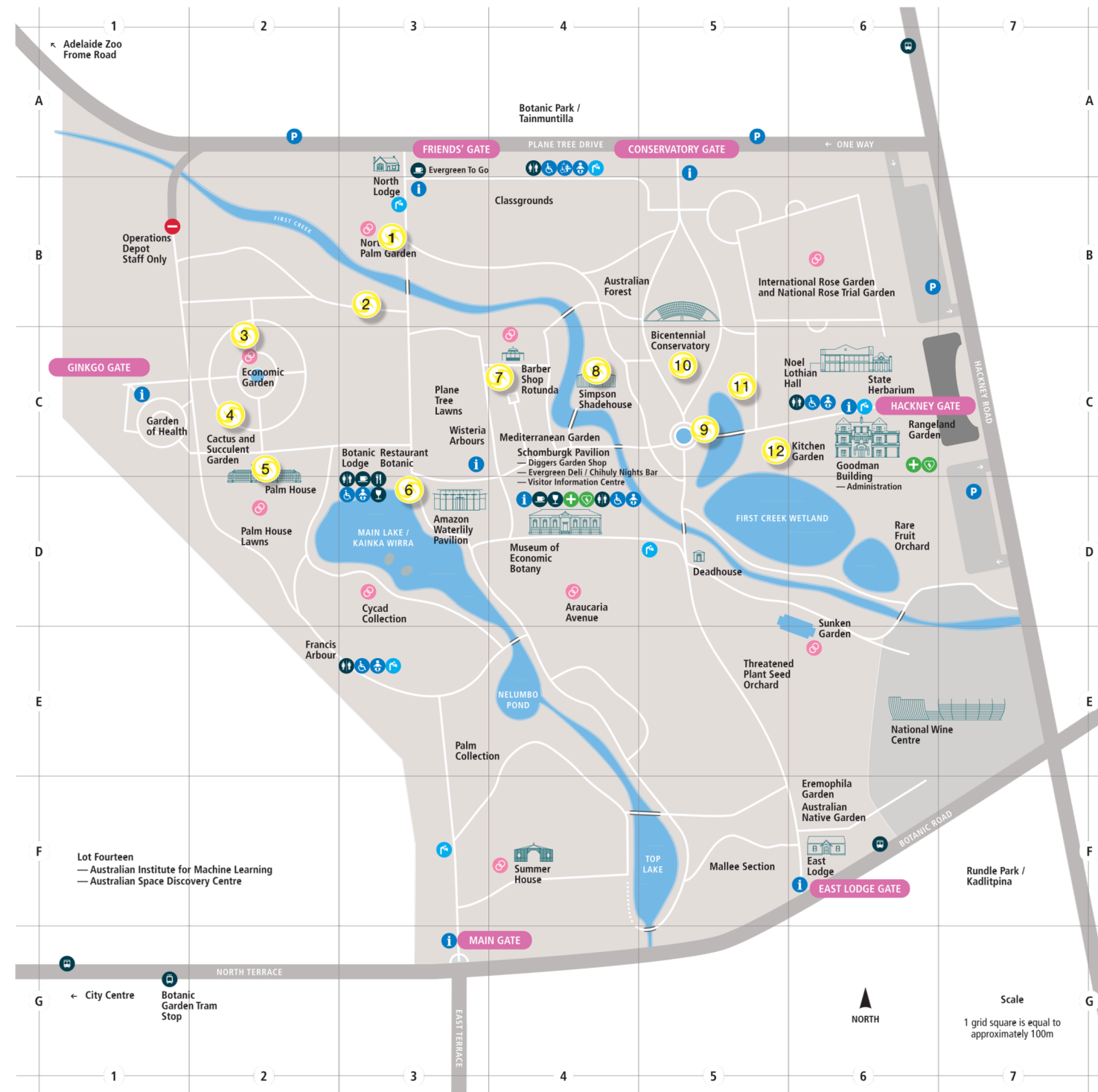

Watching Glass Grow is a Challenge Course created in collaboration between Makers Empire and the Botanic Gardens and State Herbarium for *Chihuly in the Botanic Garden*, an exhibition featuring glass art by Dale Chihuly held September 2024 to April 2025.

The Challenge Course encouraged young people to learn all about how glass is made and how artists, like artist Dale Chihuly, look at nature to inspire incredible artworks.

Watching Glass Grow had more than 4000 students take part during the Chihuly in the Garden exhibition, and from those entries, 10 were selected to be part of the virtual gallery, located around Adelaide Botanic Garden.
