


Visiting the Adelaide Botanic Garden

Adelaide Botanic Garden


We can also call it the

You can eat your food here, but please don't eat any of the plants unless your Botanical Educator says it is okay!




During your visit...

You will stay on the pathways so we don't damage any plants


You can ask lots of questions

Lots of people visit and work at the Botanic Garden so you will see people that you don't know

It is important to stay with your teacher or adult



You might see people driving Gators, which can be a bit loud

If you hear one coming, step to the side to let them through, and give a big wave!

You might hear some other loud noises around the Garden like lawn mowers or leaf blowers





This is called the **Friends Gate**

You might have travelled a long way to get to the **Botanic Garden**

There is a toilet very close by and a place to fill up your drink bottle if you need water



This is called the **Hackney Gate**

This area is called the **Schomburgk Pavillion** and is a covered and shady place with a cafe

The Museum of Economic Botany helps us learn how plants have been used by people across history

It is a quiet place with lots of things to look at





This is the **Bicentennial Conservatory**. We can call it the **Bicon**. It creates an environment similar to a rainforest



You can walk on a path on the ground or on a bridge

It can get very hot and humid on hot days



It rains in the **Bicon** just like a real rainforest

There are sprinklers on the walls that turn on when the temperature gets warm enough outside

The **Amazon Waterlily Pavilion** has plants from hot and humid climates



It can get very hot and humid on warm days


If you are very quiet, you might see some of the small fish that live in the pond





The **Palm House** is a big glasshouse that has plants from the island of Madagascar

Outside, there are lots of cacti which are very sharp, so be careful going near them!
