On Kaurna Country. <i>The Jean Flynn Presbyterian Church was identified through a desktop assessment of surviving Elizabeth Churches by Heritage South Australia. The South Australian Heritage Council added Jean Flynn Presbyterian Church to the assessment list on 18 August 2022. At this meeting, the Council will consider an assessment report and</i>

		<i>determine whether or not to provisionally enter it in the South Australian Heritage Register.</i>
7.2	Former Elizabeth South Methodist Church Hall, 114 Harvey Road, Elizabeth Grove. On Kaurna Country.	<i>The former Elizabeth South Methodist Church Hall was identified through a desktop assessment of surviving Elizabeth Churches by Heritage South Australia. The South Australian Heritage Council added the former Elizabeth South Methodist Church Hall to the assessment list on 18 August 2022. At this meeting, the Council will consider an assessment report and determine whether to provisionally enter it as a State Heritage Place in the South Australian Heritage Register.</i>
7.3	Parafield Gardens Uniting Church, 3 Shepardson Road, Parafield Gardens SA 5107. On Kaurna Country.	<i>On 4 November 2021, the South Australian Heritage Council added the Former Parafield Gardens Uniting Church to the Assessment List. At this meeting the Council will consider an assessment report and whether to provisionally enter it as a State Heritage Place in the South Australian Heritage Register.</i>
7.4	Christ Church Uniting Church, 26 King William Road, Wayville SA 5034. On Kaurna Country.	<i>On 4 November 2021, the South Australian Heritage Council added this Church to the assessment list. An assessment has now been completed and the Council will consider whether to provisionally enter it as a State Heritage Place in the South Australian Heritage Register.</i>
7.5	Pleasant Banks, Homestead Complex, Basham Beach Road, Port Elliot SA 5212. On Ngarrindjeri and Ramindjeri Country.	<i>Multiple nominations were received for the Pleasant Banks Homestead Complex, now comprising Ratalang/Basham Beach Conservation Reserve, Basham Beach Road, Port Elliot and 50 Basham Beach Road, Port Elliot. At this meeting, the Council will consider the nominations, an assessment report and then determine whether to provisionally enter it as a State Heritage Place on the South Australian Heritage Register.</i>
7.6	Torrens Island Quarantine Station - Objects Collection. On Kaurna Country.	<i>On 5 September 2024, the South Australian Heritage Council confirmed the entry of Torrens Island Quarantine Station Complex, (TIQS), 114 Trunkway, Torrens Island in the South Australian Heritage Register under s16 criteria (a), (b) and (d) of the Heritage Places Act 1993. 43 objects considered to be related to the heritage significance of the Quarantine Station and known as the Torrens Island Quarantine Station Collection remain on site and include street signs, specimen boxes,</i>

		<p><i>linens and grave markers.</i></p> <p><i>The South Australian Heritage Council will consider whether to list these objects as a collection of objects intrinsically associated with the State Heritage Place under section 14 of the Heritage Places Act 1993.</i></p>
