About the location of this SA Heritage Council meeting:

The Pilgrim Uniting Church is a State Heritage Place, listed on 14 February 1985.

Built in 1865-1867 as a memorial to Reverend T.W. Stow, the building succeeded the Congregational place of worship erected in 1839/40 in Gawler Place. Reverend Stow passed away in 1862, and the Church was built as a memorial to him.

On 7 February the foundation stone was laid by Alexander Hay.

The builders were Messer's Brown and Thompson. The beautiful carving was done by Mr. Peters formerly of Dublin and the whole of the works have been designed and carried out under the superintendence of Mr R.G. Thomas lately assisted by Mr. Garlick, architect of Adelaide.

"The building is a real ornament to the City, it is far superior in effect to any other ecclesiastical edifice in the Colony, and does great credit to the architect who designed it, to the builder's who erected it, and to the congregation who have been spirited enough to carry it out."
