5.1	Self-Assessment tool <i>This meeting is the last meeting of this group of Council members with their term ending 1 April 2021. Council will therefore spend time at this meeting evaluating its performance and preparing recommendations for the incoming Council members.</i>
5.2	Decision Tree for Managing Nominations <i>Council will consider the method by which an incoming nomination is processed by Heritage South Australia through interrogation using a decision tree.</i>
5.3	Climate Change presentation <i>The Council will hear from Department for Environment and Water representatives on action being taken to reduce the impact of climate change in South Australia.</i> <i>The South Australian Government Climate Change Action Plan 2021–2025 describes government-led objectives and actions to help to build a strong, climate smart economy, further reduce greenhouse gas emissions, and support South Australia to adapt to a changing climate.</i>
5.4	1 Bagot Street, North Adelaide <i>This place has recently been nominated by a member of the public for consideration for State Heritage listing. Given there is a demolition application being processed, the Council will consider a request to hear from the owner prior to its decision to either provisionally enter this place on the SA Heritage Register or to reject the nomination. The decision to enter or not will occur at a later date.</i>

5.5	Correspondence - Australian Heritage Strategy Review <i>The Australian Heritage Strategy was released in 2015. It sets out a national approach over 10 years relating to:</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>identifying, protecting and conserving Australia’s unique heritage</i> • <i>presenting and communicating related stories.</i> <i>The Council has been given an opportunity to provide comment on the Strategy and will discuss this at this meeting.</i>
6	ITEMS TO BE CONSIDERED FOR PROVISIONAL ENTRY ON THE SA HERITAGE REGISTER
6.1	Southern Park 16, Adelaide Park Lands <i>This place has been nominated by a member of the public and Council will consider the nomination and determine whether it meets any of the criteria to be provisionally entered as a State Heritage Place.</i>
6.2	Western Cell Block, Camp 14 Loveday Internment Camp Complex <i>The Loveday Internment Camp Complex is proposed as an important part of the State’s history as it is the only purpose-built internment facility in South Australia and demonstrates the role South Australia played in securing POWs and civilian detainees during the Second World War. Council has previously been provided with the nomination and an assessment of the Western Cell Block part of the complex. At this meeting the Council will be provided with an update on discussions with the owner of this place.</i>
6.3	Piggery Breeding Pens, Loveday Internment Camp Complex <i>Council will consider an assessment for this place and determine whether it meets any of the criteria to provisionally enter it as a State Heritage Place on the South Australian Heritage Register.</i>
6.4	Holy Cross Catholic Church, 159-165 Goodwood Road, Millswood <i>Council will consider an assessment for this place and determine whether it meets any of the criteria to provisionally enter it as a State Heritage Place on the South Australian Heritage Register. The Holy Cross Catholic Church is proposed as an outstanding example of late twentieth-century ecclesiastical Modernist architecture in South Australia. It features an extensive collection of works by prolific and influential South Australian émigré religious artist Voitre Marek, who served as artistic consultant during the church’s design and construction.</i>
