At this meeting, the Council will consider any submissions made by the owner and determine whether to confirm the collection in the South Australian Heritage Register.		
7.3	Martindale Hall Heraldic Collection		
	On 10 December 2020, the Council provisionally entered the Heraldic Collection as a State Heritage Object in the South Australian Heritage Register as it was found to be intrinsically related to the heritage significance of Martindale Hall (s16(2)(c) of the Heritage Places Act 1993. At this meeting, the Council will consider any submissions made by the owner and determine whether to confirm the collection in the South Australian Heritage Register.		
7.4	Cummins House Furniture Collection		
	On 16 July 2020, the Council provisionally entered the Cummins House Furniture Collection as twenty-one individual State Heritage Objects in the South Australian Heritage Register, as the objects were found under s16(2)(c) of the Heritage Places Act 1993 to be intrinsically related to the heritage significance of Cummins House. At this meeting, the Council will consider any submissions made by the owner and determine whether to confirm the collection in the South Australian Heritage Register.
