	6.1	Former Prospect Air Raid Precautions Sub-Control Station <i>This place has been nominated by a member of the public and Council will consider the nomination and determine whether it meets any of the criteria to be provisionally entered as a State Heritage Place.</i>
	6.2	<u>Item related to West End Brewery Nomination</u> Former West End Brewery Garden (former SABCo Brewery Garden), Thebarton <i>A member of the public nominated the West End Brewery, which is an approximately 8-hectare site fronting Port Road, Thebarton, for consideration for State Heritage Listing in the South Australian Heritage Register (the Register). The nomination identified a number of buildings/structures and suggested that due to the diversity of buildings/structures, the site as a whole meets all seven s16 criteria in the Heritage Places Act 1993.</i> <i>At this meeting, the Council will consider a separate assessment report that has been prepared for the West End Brewery Garden.</i>

6.3	<p><u>Item related to West End Brewery Nomination</u></p> <p>AESCo Transformer, Holland Street, Thebarton</p> <p><i>The AESCo Transformer is an example of the early electrical infrastructure used in South Australia.</i></p> <p><i>As part of the initial nomination of a much broader site (the West End Brewery), the Council will consider a separate assessment report for the AESCo Transformer.</i></p>
6.4	<p><u>Item related to West End Brewery Nomination</u></p> <p>Plaque commemorating 'Theberton Cottage' (Home of Colonel William Light).</p> <p><i>The Council may include as part of the South Australian Heritage Register any object that is, in the opinion of the Council, an object of heritage significance. The Council will consider listing the plaque commemorating 'Theberton Cottage' as related the listing of Theberton Hall. An object can only be listed if it is intrinsically related to a State Heritage Place or Area.</i></p>
6.5	<p>Green Waterhole – Tank Cave Fossil Complex</p> <p><i>The Council will consider a Heritage Assessment that has been prepared by a working group led by Anna Pope, Heritage South Australia, comprising fossil experts from South Australia and interstate. This place is recommended for State Heritage Listing.</i></p>

7.1	<p>Holy Cross Catholic Church, 159 -165 Goodwood Road, Millswood</p> <p><i>On 18 February 2021, the Council provisionally entered Holy Cross Catholic Church, 159-165 Goodwood Road, Millswood in the South Australian Heritage Register as a State Heritage Place as it meets criteria (d), (e) and (g) under s16 of the Heritage Places Act 1993.</i></p> <p><i>At this meeting, the Council will consider submissions made during the three month consultation period, and determine whether to confirm this as a State Heritage Place.</i></p>
7.2	<p>Piggery Breeding Pens – Loveday Internment Camp Complex, Costello Road, Loveday</p> <p><i>On 18 February 2021, the Council provisionally entered the Piggery Breeding Pens, Loveday Internment Camp Complex, located on Costello Road, Loveday as a State Heritage Place in the South Australia Heritage Register as the Council found it meets criteria (a) and (b) under section 16(1) of the Heritage Places Act 1993.</i></p>

		<p><i>At this meeting, the Council will consider submissions made during the three month consultation period, and determine whether to confirm this as a State Heritage Place.</i></p>
	7.3	<p>Rosetta Head Well and Whaling Station Site, Franklin Parade, Encounter Bay</p> <p><i>On 10 December 2020, the Council considered the Assessment Report for Rosetta Head Well and Whaling Station Site, Franklin Parade, Encounter Bay. After considering the Assessment Report, the Council provisionally entered the Rosetta Head Well and Whaling Station Site in the South Australian Heritage Register under criteria (b) and (c) of section 16 (1) of the Heritage Places Act 1993.</i></p> <p><i>At this meeting, the Council will consider submissions made during the three month consultation period, and determine whether to confirm this as a State Heritage Place.</i></p>
