7.1	Nain Lutheran Church, 196 Nain Road, Nain via Greenock

		<p><i>This place was nominated by a member of the public. At this meeting the Council will consider the nomination and an assessment report and determine whether this place meets any of the criteria under section 16 of Heritage Places Act 1993 to warrant provisional entry on the South Australian Heritage Register.</i></p>
7.2	<p>Camp 10 Detention Cell Block, Loveday Internment Camp Complex, Yeo Road, Loveday</p> <p><i>Loveday Internment Camp, near Berri, interred prisoners of war and civilian internees from 1941 to 1946 during the course of WWII in South Australia. At its peak in 1943, the Loveday Internment Camp housed around 6,000 Italian, German and Japanese prisoners of war and internees, and 1,400 military personnel. Loveday became Australia's largest detention facility during the war.</i></p> <p><i>On 1 August 2019, the Council considered a discussion paper that identified elements of the Loveday Internment Camp and recommended a number of sites for heritage assessment, including Camp 10, Detention Cell Block. At this meeting the Council will consider an assessment report and determine whether this place meets any of the criteria under section 16 of Heritage Places Act 1993 to warrant provisional entry on the South Australian Heritage Register.</i></p>	
7.3	<p>Camp 14 Eastern Detention Cell Block, Loveday Internment Camp Complex, Whateley Road, Loveday.</p> <p><i>This is another place recommended for heritage assessment that forms part of the Loveday Internment Camp. At this meeting the Council will consider an assessment report and determine whether this place meets any of the criteria under section 16 of Heritage Places Act 1993 to warrant provisional entry on the South Australian Heritage Register.</i></p>	
7.4	<p>Camp 14 Sullage Treatment Works, Loveday Internment Camp Complex, Whateley Road, Loveday.</p> <p><i>This is another place recommended for heritage assessment that forms part of the Loveday Internment Camp. At this meeting the Council will consider an assessment report and determine whether this place meets any of the criteria under section 16 of Heritage Places Act 1993 to warrant provisional entry on the South Australian Heritage Register.</i></p>	
7.5	<p>Mortuary Slab and Table, Loveday Internment Camp Complex, Whateley Road, Loveday.</p> <p><i>This is another place recommended for heritage assessment that forms part of the Loveday Internment Camp. At this meeting the Council will consider an assessment report and determine whether this place meets any of the criteria under section 16 of Heritage Places Act 1993 to warrant provisional entry on the South Australian Heritage Register.</i></p>	
8	<p>ITEMS TO BE CONSIDERED FOR CONFIRMATION ON THE SA HERITAGE REGISTER</p>	
8.1	<p>Former Prospect ARP Sub-Control Station, 4/1 Menzies Crescent, Prospect</p> <p><i>The former Prospect ARP Sub-Control Station formed part of the Adelaide metropolitan Air Raid Precautions (ARP) emergency communications network, designed to coordinate the civilian response to expected Japanese air raids during the Second World War. As a surviving component of this</i></p>	

	<p><i>network, the former Prospect ARP Sub-Control Station helps to demonstrate the degree to which South Australians feared attack from the air, the extent of measures taken to respond to the potential threat.</i></p> <p><i>This place was provisionally entered as a State Heritage Place under criteria a), b) and d) by the Council on the 5th August 2021. At this meeting the Council will consider any submissions received and determine whether or not to Confirm it as a State Heritage Place on the South Australian Heritage Register.</i></p> <p><i>Criteria (a) it demonstrates important aspects of the evolution or pattern of the State's history</i></p> <p><i>Criteria (b) it has rare, uncommon or endangered qualities that are of cultural significance</i></p> <p><i>Criteria (d) it is an outstanding representative of a particular class of place of cultural significance</i></p>
8.2	<p>Former West End Brewery Garden, 107 Port Road, Thebarton</p> <p><i>This place was provisionally entered as a State Heritage Place under criterion g) by the Council on the 5th August 2021. At this meeting the Council will consider any submissions received and determine whether or not to Confirm it as a State Heritage Place on the South Australian Heritage Register.</i></p> <p><i>Criterion g) it has special association with the life or work of a person or organisation or an event of historical importance</i></p>
