7.1(a) BLUE CARBON POLICY OPPORTUNITIES & UPDATING BOARD POLICY

N McFarlane provided the Board with a brief update on the next stages of the implementation of the Blue Carbon strategy.

S Detmar gave a presentation to the Board on saltmarsh mapping, application and potential projects. The presentation covered the status of blue carbon projects within DEW, the Blue Carbon Strategy and prospectus, the New Life for our Coastal Environment - Blue Carbon Project, Coast Protection Board Policy Update and Grant Assessments.

The Presiding Member tabled a chart of *Roles Table & Continuum* to assist with clarifying potential roles the Board could adopt to help frame a discussion around potential policy changes in relation to blue carbon.

Following discussion, the Board resolved to:

Action: DEW to present draft amendments to the Board's policy at its February 2021 meeting, reflecting the Board's position on blue carbon opportunities.

Action: DEW to incorporate a blue carbon component into its grant assessment process as part of the 2021 review and provide to the Board for review and endorsement prior to the 2021/22 Board works program.

7.1(b) BETTER BOAT RAMP OUTCOMES- UPDATING BOARD POLICY

M Townsend provided the Board with the key points of the paper.

The paper provided a summary on the progress and decisions to date in terms of the Boards position in the past, present and looking to the future for boat ramp policy.

The importance of the role of development applications was discussed, including the extent to which the Board should adopt a stronger position when future problems are foreseen.

9.1(a) LOCAL GOVERNMENT RELATIONSHIPS

A meeting was held on 12 November 2020 to discuss further engagement opportunities with local government, chaired by J Tate and attended by A Sandery, C Hart, M Townsend, L Bacon, A Wilson and A Gray.

The meeting considered the roles and responsibilities of the Board, DEW and local government; what is working well; what all parties need from the relationship; what could be improved; and what the next steps might be.

The Presiding Member expressed a preference for a multi-year action plan rather than a formal document, such as a MoU to advance the relationship.

10.4 <u>2020-21 CPB BUDGET FLINDERS UNIVERSITY BATHYMETRY</u>

Dr Graziela Miot da Silva, Senior Lecturer in Coastal and Marine Geology, College of Science & Engineering at Flinders University provided the Board with a presentation on a proposal for the acquisition of new survey equipment. The equipment has improved technology for collecting accurate and high resolution topographic and bathymetric elevation data. The university is seeking

support from the Board and other organisations to apply for a grant to purchase the equipment from the Australian Research Council.

Note: Board members noted that the funding being sought was for the capital cost of the survey equipment and that there would also be considerable operating and maintenance costs over the life of the equipment.

Note: The proposal from Flinders University requesting partner contributions in its application for an Australian Research Council grant to purchase equipment for capturing nearshore bathymetric and topographic data.

Approve: In principle, to provide support, as a partner contribution to the Flinders University proposal, of \$20,000 from the 2021-22 Board budget, subject to the application being successful (outcome in late 2021).
