Thank you for your internal review application dated 26 August 2022 regarding seeking access to:

"A copy of all documents (including but not limited to hard copy or electronic briefings, minutes, reports, emails, letters, meeting agendas, diary entries, event attendance records and any other correspondence) relating to the Department's advice on the proposal by Mr Richard Ladley to develop tidal energy generation".

Timeline: between 21/03/2022 to 07/07/2022

Your original application for access was determined as refused access on the basis that a determination was not provided within the statutory timeframe. You sought an internal review of this matter.

On the 9 September 2022 the department contacted your office to inform you that a late determination would be made in accord with section 19(2a) of the *Freedom of Information Act 1991*.

DETERMINATION

I wish to advise that as Principal Officer I have determined to vary the original determination. Full access has been granted for documents numbered 1, 1.2 and 2 and partial access to document numbered 1.1. The attached document schedule provides details of the exemptions and public interest test.

YOUR APPEAL RIGHTS

If you are dissatisfied with this determination, you are entitled to exercise your rights to external review and appeal as outlined in attachment 3. If you decide to apply for an external review you must contact the Ombudsman SA within 30 calendar days of receipt of this letter.

Should an FOI applicant believe an agency has failed to identify all of the documents within the scope of their FOI application, they can make a complaint to the Ombudsman under the Ombudsman Act 1972. 

BACKGROUND

On 27 April 2022, Mr Richard Ladley, Director, Australian Desalination Irrigation, emailed your adviser, Mr Jason Gillick, seeking a meeting on and/or a letter of support for his proposal to build new tidal energy generation capacity for the desalination of seawater for irrigation purposes in South Australia, Victoria and New South Wales.

Mr Ladley is seeking funding through the National Water Grid Authority to undertake further feasibility analysis on his proposal, which in a South Australian context includes:



Mr Ladley is not seeking any funding from state governments, but is looking for an indication of support from South Australia, Victoria and New South Wales to progress discussions with relevant Commonwealth Government agencies.

The Department for Environment and Water, on referral from the former Minister for Environment and Water's office, has facilitated a number of connections between Mr Ladley and relevant industry stakeholders in South Australia over the last two years, including Primary Producers SA and the South Australian Chamber of Mines and Energy.

The former minister also provided a letter in support of Mr Ladley's representations for funding on 17 March 2022. No other direct support for the project has been indicated from other current and former ministers' at the national or state level to date. Correspondence dated 12 February 2022 from the Victorian Minister for Transport Infrastructure, the Hon Jacinta Allen MP, advises that 'the Victorian Government is not in a position to provide any support or funding towards the project'.

DISCUSSION

With the election of the new Government in South Australia, Mr Ladley is seeking a similar letter of support provided by the former minister from you as the new Minister for Climate, Environment and Water.

Mr Ladley's proposal for developing tidal energy in South Australia, desalinating seawater and transmitting water to dry regions for irrigation activity is a significant infrastructure initiative. There are a range of matters that require detailed assessment before any such project could be initiated, including, but not limited to:

- The identification of end-users/markets who are willing to pay for new irrigation water;
- Infrastructure requirements for water transport to end-users and the associated

impact on the cost of the water produced;

- Governance structures for project construction and ongoing operation;
- Potential environmental impacts and shipping transport implications from the construction of tidal energy generators in Upper Spencer Gulf; and
- Community views and acceptance of the project.

Mr Ladley's proposal is also not a priority against other potential water infrastructure projects for investment by the Australian Government in South Australia at this time.

A draft letter of response to Mr Ladley, similar to that provided by the Victorian Minister for Transport Infrastructure, is provided as Attachment 1 for your consideration.

Thank you for your email to my adviser, Mr Jason Gillick, dated 27 April 2022, regarding your proposal to develop new tidal energy generation capacity for the desalination of seawater for irrigation purposes in South Australia, Victoria and New South WalesWater is critical for South Australia's environment, economy and communities, with its availability and use likely to have a significant impact on the state's future prosperity. Further innovation around water is essential for sustainable industry growth, productivity and international competitiveness, particularly given the likely impacts of climate change on this precious resource.
