On 03 September 2021 a revised scope was confirmed with you to:

"I am seeking documents relating to the approval obtained by the applicant, Southern Launch. Space from the Wildlife Ethics Committee (WEC), Department for Environment and Water in respect of the proposed test launch campaign at Whalers Way. This application is to not include all and every document relating to this topic, but centralise on the applicant, Southern Launch. Space, the finalisation of the approvals process and outcome. Specifically, the documents I require are:

- The Submission (application) from Southern Launch. Space to the Wildlife Ethics Committee (inclusive of any addendums).
- All documents held by DEW, that were sent to or received from Southern Launch. Space related to the WEC application.
- Documents relevant to the Southern Launch. Space application created for the purpose of tabling the formal review process/s (e.g. meeting agenda, agenda papers, meeting minutes, action items of this application) for which a decision was intended to be made in relation to the WEC Southern Launch. Space application.
- Documents that formally record the outcome of the Southern Launch. Space formal WEC review process".

Timeframe: between 9/03/2021 to 2/09/2021

As the agency did not determine the application within 30 days of receiving it, by the operation of section 19(2)(b) of the FOI Act, the agency is taken to have determined the application by refusing access. Section 19(2a) of the FOI Act provides that an agency may give access to a document on an application after the period within which it was required to deal with the application (and any such determination is to be taken to have been made under this Act).

DETERMINATION

A search of the Department's records have found 21 documents held by this agency within the scope of your request. As a DEW Accredited FOI Officer, I have determined to grant full access to one document and partial access to 20 documents.

Section 20 of the Act provides that an agency may refuse access to a document if it is an exempt document under the Act. The documents, or parts of the document to which I am refusing access and the reasons for the refusal are summarised in the attached document schedule (Attachment 1) and the relevant clauses and public interest test reasoning are provided at Attachment 2. The release documents are provided as Attachment 3.

The department will provide the determination electronically.

FEES AND CHARGES

There is no further charge for processing this application.

YOUR APPEAL RIGHTS

If you are dissatisfied with this determination, you are entitled to exercise your rights to internal review and appeal as outlined in the attached documentation, by completing the <u>'FOI</u> Application Form – For Internal Review of a Determination'.

If you decide to apply to exercise your rights to review, the completed form must be returned within 30 days to:



1. Short Lay Summary (Maximum 100 words)

A lay summary is a brief summary of a research project that is used to explain complex ideas and technical and scientific terms to people who do not have prior knowledge about the subject.

The Project is comprised S8(1) monitoring of the behaviour of long-nosed fur seals on Liguanea Island (part of Lincoln National Park) during a test launch of a rocket from the proposed Whalers Way Orbital Launch Complex south of Port Lincoln.

2. Provide a lay description of the project and its aims, and its hypothesis.

The aim of the Project is to verify noise modelling and the desktop assessment that noise (and visual impact) associated with a rocket launch would not significantly disturb seals on the island, i.e. would result in no or only short-term movement into the water.

Liguanea Island, which is part of Lincoln National Park, is 5–8 km from the proposed Whalers Way Orbital Launch Complex south of Port Lincoln. It has breeding colonies of both long-nosed fur seal *Arctocephalus forsteri* (LNFS) and Australian sea lion *Neophoca cinerea* (ASL) (currently Vulnerable under the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1972* but Endangered under the EPBC Act 1999). The maximum estimated abundances of these species are about 9,000 and 165, respectively. ASL tend to be concentrated on the southern peninsula of the island, and LNFS are generally within four sub-colonies along the eastern coast (J Diversity 2021).

Published literature and experience from seal colonies near other rocket launching facilities in the United States of America suggest that significant behavioural impacts on seals are unlikely below 90 dB (100 dB for most species). At higher noise levels there is the possibility of movement into the water, and in extreme cases a stampede with pups possibly being trampled or separated from their mothers. Experience from the United States has shown that seals moving into the water as a result of rocket launches haul out again within minutes to two hours. During more than 20 years of launches in the vicinity of seal colonies in Alaska and California there has been no evidence of any stampede resulting in a trampling of pups (Rauch 2017).

The rocket launch would result in elevated noise levels for less than two minutes. Noise modelling predicted that noise on Liguanea Island (and at Cape Wiles) would be below the aforementioned 90 dB threshold except at the northern end of the island (for some launches from one of the two launch sites). Sonic booms would be generated several kilometres offshore during ascent, but are typically directed in front of the rocket and would not be close enough or strong enough, due to the relatively small size of the rockets, to reach the earth's surface (J Diversity 2021).

on standby at Port Lincoln, would be transported to the island from Whalers Way by helicopter.

The procedures are:

Launch – An impact assessment using noise modelling, noise impact criteria sourced from the literature and experience from other rocket launching sites near seal colonies has concluded that there would be no significant disturbance on seals from launches at Whalers Way. Although it is possible that there may be movement of animals from a rested to active state, with at least some animals entering into the water, no long-term impacts are expected. The possibility of pups being trampled during a stampede is considered unlikely.

Some mitigation measures would be used to reduce noise impacts during rocket take-off. The test launch would occur outside of the breeding season for both ASL and LNFS.

Any impact arising from the test launch is justified because of the need to verify that the noise emitted during a rocket launch does not create significant disturbance to seals.

Southern Launch is proposing to establish an orbital launch complex from which there will be 30 launches annually, each with the possibility of impacting seal populations on Liguanea Island. An impact assessment using noise modelling, noise impact criteria sourced from the literature and experience from other rocket launching sites near seal colonies has concluded that there would be no significant disturbance on seals from launches at Whalers Way.

However, greater confidence that ongoing launches will not impact seals can be achieved by verifying noise levels and monitoring the seals during a test launch. The risks to the animals from a single launch are considered to be low when weighed against the increased certainty about impacts on seal behaviour that would be gained from the test launch.

As the aim of the project is to verify that launches will not significantly disturb seals on Liguanea Island, it is not possible to test with captive populations, which are limited or non-existent anyway.

Please find attached a minor amendment form describing an urgent modification that we require for the Southern Launch test launch project prior to its expiry on 31 May 2021.
