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Mammals

Plains mouse

STATUS: **V** Federal **V** SA

Relatively large eyes, head and ears

Brownish-grey to grey above

Tail can be equal to body length

White or cream undersurface



Birds

Plains-wanderer

STATUS: **C** Federal **E** SA

Brown plumage - white and blackish marks, with spots and streaks on the head and neck

Females have a distinctive white-spotted collar around the neck and reddish-brown chest

Straw-yellow legs and bills



Plants

Needle Wattle

STATUS: **V** Federal **V** SA

Leaves are needle-like, sharply pointed, and four-angled

Flower-heads are spherical, golden-yellow in colour



Yellow-footed Rock-wallaby STATUS: **V** Federal **V** SA

Prominent dark mid-dorsal stripe from top of head to middle of back

White stripes on cheeks, sides and hips

Tail is cylindrical, orange-brown and marked with darker bars or rings. Can be as long as their body

Forearms, hind legs, feet and ears are orange-yellow



Pink Cockatoo EASTERN STATUS: **E** Federal **R** SA

Long, forward-pointing, scarlet and yellow-banded crest

* *Lophochroa leadbeateri*

Mostly white, with pink on the sides of the head, around the neck and underbody, and under the wings



Slender Bell-fruit

STATUS: **V** Federal **E** SA

Fruit are bell-shaped and segmented

Mature trees can sometimes lean to one side
