At this meeting the Council will consider the nomination and the assessment report and determine whether it meets the threshold for listing as a provisional entry in the South Australian Heritage Register.</i></p>
	7.3	<p>Green Waterhole – Tank Cave Fossil Complex. Lot 550 Princes Highway Tantanoola. On the Country of the First Nations of the South East.</p> <p><i>Council will consider a revised assessment report for this place and determine whether it meets the threshold for listing as a provisional entry in the South Australian Heritage Register.</i></p>
8	ITEMS TO BE CONSIDERED FOR CONFIRMATION ON THE SA HERITAGE REGISTER	
	8.1	<p>Graham and Barbara Dickson House, 4 Morola Ave, Rostrevor (SHP 26597). On Kurna Country.</p> <p><i>This place was provisionally entered into the South Australian (SA) Heritage Register on 12 June 2024 under section 17(2)(b) of the Heritage Places Act 1993. This protected the place while an assessment was undertaken, and it triggered a three-month consultation period.</i></p> <p><i>Twenty-four (24) submissions were received during the consultation period.</i></p> <p><i>The Council will consider the submissions, oral representations and the assessment report, and then decide whether to confirm this place in the SA Heritage Register or to remove this place from the SA Heritage Register.</i></p>
	8.2	<p>Epworth Building, 33/33B Pirie Street, Adelaide. On Kurna Country.</p> <p><i>On 5 September 2024, the Council provisionally entered the Epworth Building in the SA Heritage Register as a State Heritage Place as it meets criterion (e) and (g) under s16 of the Heritage Places Act 1993.</i></p> <p><i>One submission was received during the consultation period.</i></p> <p><i>The Council will consider the submission, the oral representation and then determine whether to confirm this place in the SA Heritage Register or remove the place from the SA Heritage Register.</i></p>
