7	FOR DISCUSSION / DECISION
7.1	Dhawura Ngilan (Remembering Country) – 5 year review. <i>The Heritage Chairs and Officials of Australia and New Zealand (HCOANZ) endorsed Dhawura Ngilan (Remembering Country) on the 16 September 2020. The Council will review progress relating to implementing its responsibilities related to Dhawura Ngilan.</i>
7.2	Consult First Nations <i>The Council recognises the importance of engaging early with Aboriginal groups in relation to heritage assessments that may relate to Aboriginal lands, Aboriginal use of lands or other Aboriginal connection with country. At this meeting the Council will consider a review of its guideline for consulting with Aboriginal people.</i>

7.3	Prioritisation of Assessment List (including 1946-1999 places). <i>At this meeting, the Council will consider how it will prioritise places identified and nominated for assessment. There are approximately 200 places built between 1946-1999 that will be part of this consideration.</i>
7.4	Status of Heritage Assessments <i>The Council will receive an update on the status of places nominated for assessment. The Council can consider nominations from the public and nominations it has made.</i>
7.5	Guideline – Statues and Monuments <i>The Council will consider a draft Guideline on State Heritage listed statues and monuments that might be considered to have contentious or problematic histories.</i>
8	ITEMS TO BE CONSIDERED FOR PROVISIONAL ENTRY IN THE SA HERITAGE REGISTER
8.1	Former GJ Coles & Company Adelaide Store, 112 – 118 Building, Rundle Street. On Kaurna Country. <i>On 13 March 2024, a member of the public nominated this place for listing as a State Heritage Place in the South Australian Heritage Register (the Register) as they believe it meets criteria (a), (b) and (e) under s16(1) of the Heritage Places Act 1993 (the Act).</i> <i>An Assessment of the Former G. J. Coles & Company Adelaide Store recommends that the place meets criteria (a), (b) and (e) under s16(1) of the Act for listing as a State Heritage Place.</i> <i>The Council will consider the nomination and assessment report and determine whether or not it meets the threshold for provisional entry in the SA Heritage Register.</i>
8.2	St John's Lutheran Church, Kapunda Street, Eudunda. On Ngadjuri Country. <i>This place was nominated for assessment by the Council.</i> <i>A Heritage Assessment Report has been prepared for this place and it recommends that the church does not meet any criteria under s16(1) of the Heritage Places Act 1993 for listing as a State Heritage Place.</i> <i>The Council will consider the assessment report and determine whether or not it meets the threshold for provisional entry in the SA Heritage Register.</i>

8.3	Onkaparinga Woollen Mill Collection, Lobethal Woollen Mill, 1 Lobethal Road, Lobethal SA 5241. On Peramangk Country. <i>On 22 March 2024, the Council received a public nomination for the 'Onkaparinga Woollen Mill Museum Inc. National Significance Collection' for consideration for listing as a State Heritage Object in the Register.</i> <i>At this meeting, the Council will consider whether or not to provisionally enter this collection as an Object in the Register.</i>
9	ITEMS TO BE CONSIDERED FOR CONFIRMATION IN THE SA HERITAGE REGISTER
9.1	Former Malcolm Reid's Emporium, 187 – 195 Rundle Street, Adelaide (SHP 26610). On Kaurna Country. <i>On 15 January 2025, the Chair of the South Australian Heritage Council (the Council), provisionally entered this place in the Register under s17(2)(b) of the Heritage Places Act 1993, to protect the place while it is assessed as it is likely to meet s16 criteria (a) and (b) of the Act.</i> <i>The period for making a public submission closed on 15 May 2025. One submission was received against confirmation.</i> <i>On 14 August 2025, the Council accepted that the Assessment Report prepared by Heritage SA adequately addresses criteria (a), (b) and (g) under section 16(1) of the Act such that the Council would continue to consider whether to Confirm this place in the Register. The Council halted any further consideration of the item until after having the opportunity to fully consider the written and oral representation.</i> <i>At this meeting, the Council will hear an oral representation and consider whether to Confirm this place in the Register.</i>
9.2	Green Waterhole – Tank Cave Fossil Complex, Lot 550, Princes Highway, Tantanoola (SHP 26530). On First Nations of the South East Country. <i>On 8 May 2025, the Council provisionally entered this place in the Register under criterion (c) of s16(1) of the Heritage Places Act 1993 (the Act).</i> <i>The Council also designated this place as a place of palaeontological, geological and speleological significance under section 14(7)(a) of the Act, providing special protections pursuant to Part 5 of the Act.</i> <i>The period for making a public submission closed on 15 August 2025. No submissions were received.</i> <i>At this meeting the Council will consider confirming this place in the Register.</i>
9.3	Mount Wudinna and Environs, Mount Wudinna Access, Wudinna (SHP 17060). On Barngarla Country.

		<i>On 26 June 2025, the Council provisionally entered this place in the Register under criterion (c) of s16(1) of the Heritage Places Act 1993 (the Act).</i> <i>The Council also designated this as place of geological significance under section 14(7)(a) of the Act, providing special protections pursuant to Part 5 of the Act.</i> <i>The period for making a public submission closed on 2 October 2025. No submissions were received.</i> <i>At this meeting the Council will consider confirming this place in the Register.</i>
10	ITEMS FOR REVISION	
	10.1	Reassessment of Former JF Paech House, stone outbuilding and two slab barns (SHP 22797). On Peramangk Country. <i>On 10 April 2013, the Council provisionally entered this place in the Register. On 25 October 2013, the place was confirmed as a State Heritage Place.</i> <i>It has been found that two land parcels containing an element of significance, one of the two slab barns, were not included at provisional entry or confirmation. It has also been found that there are duplicate listings of this entry in the Register.</i> <i>The Council will consider approving the reassessment of the State Heritage Place so as to include all elements of significance and seeks additional advice on a process to delete duplicate listings from the Register.</i>

Under delegated authority, the Chair considered and determined not to provisionally enter this place to protect it while it is assessed under section 17 (2) (b) of the Heritage Places Act 1993. The nomination will therefore be assessed as part of its regular work program. The purpose of this item is to update other Council members on this matter.</i>
