MINUTES

The 143rd Meeting of the South Australian Heritage Council (the Council) was held on Level 10, 81 – 95 Waymouth Street, Adelaide on Thursday 15 February 2024.

Statement of Acknowledgement

The Chairperson acknowledged that the land that the Council members meet on today is the traditional lands for Kaurna people and that the Council respect their spiritual relationship with their country. The Chairperson also acknowledged the Kaurna people as the custodians of the Adelaide region and that their cultural and heritage beliefs are still as important to the living Kaurna people today.

1. WELCOME AND APOLOGIES

Ms Verschoor welcomed all to the 143rd meeting of the South Australian Heritage Council (the Council).

There were apologies from Mr Gavin Leydon and Ms Jan Ferguson.

2. ADOPTION OF AGENDA AND DECLARATION OF CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Agenda

The agenda was adopted.

Declarations of conflict of interest

Ms Marcus Rolfe declared a conflict of interest for Item 8.1 – St Patrick’s Schoolhouse, as his firm URPS provided advice to the property owner. Further, declared a conflict in relation to a matter discussed In-Camera.

Mrs Deborah Lindsay declared a conflict of interest for Item 8.1 - St Patrick’s Schoolhouse, as DASH Architects provided advice to the property owner.

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Ms Kate McDougall declared a conflict of interest in relation to Item 7.2 Nookamka No. 1 (Lake Bonney) Pumping Station Dam Wall Ruin as she had made recommendations in relation to a heritage survey she had authored.

3 PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES

Council considered the draft minutes of 7 December 2023 and 12 January 2024 meeting and approved them without amendment.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Approved** the minutes of 7 December 2023.
- **Approved** the minutes of 12 January 2024.

4. ACTION ITEMS

The Council noted the status of action items.

It was agreed that the assessment of the Dardanelles Memorial would be removed from the Action List and placed on the the Assessment list.

Before her term on Council ends, Ms McDougall noted she will meet with Dr Bird to consider surveys and then formulate advice for the Council in relation to any possible areas that could be considered for recommendation as State Heritage Areas.

Ms Voigt provided an update to Council on the Heritage Tourism Grants for 2024.

ACTION: Mr Hanna to advise Council members when applications for Heritage Tourism Grants goes live to the public.

ACTION: Heritage SA to provide information to Council about resources and costs associated with developing and maintaining its own website.

RESOLUTION

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Noted** the status of the action list.

5. IN CAMERA DISCUSSION

The Council had an in-camera discussion pursuant to section 7 (6) of the *Heritage Places Act 1993*.

The following text was approved for release at Council's 14 August 2025 meeting.

5.1A – Legislative Reform

Mr Leonard Blazeby discussed the proposed reform of the Heritage Places Act 1993. Mr Blazeby indicated it was important that the SA Heritage Council has input into this process.

Council agreed to discuss one legislative reform theme at each strategic meeting in 2024. DEW to provide a list of topics for each meeting for 2024 for Council's consideration.

Council agreed that "Demolition by Neglect" would be the first theme it would consider and some case studies would be provided.

Council agreed that Local Heritage reform needed to be a theme it considers.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Approved** a forward program of themes for legislative reforms be added to the agenda for each strategic meeting during 2024.

5.1B – text removed for publication

5.1C – Listing matters

Dr Bird brought the following listing matters to the attention of the Council:

- Noted that the Regent Theatre listing only relates to the façade.
- The extent of listing for State Heritage Place 14402 – Original Cottage and Stone Building is correct. The listing is not a complex.
- Noted that some of the Animal Quarantine buildings are significant within the Torrens Island Quarantine Station. There are other elements that were not included in the original listing and Heritage SA recommended re-assessment. It was also noted that the site is subject to a development application.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Noted** the advice provided by Heritage SA.

6 ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION / DECISION

6.1 Review of Performance / Self-Assessment exercise

It was noted that the self-assessment exercise completed by Council members was to returned to Mr Hanna.

Ms Voigt facilitated the Council discussion of the Maturing Assessment Tool. The following discussion and scores were agreed by Council:

Membership and Capability Score = 4

It was agreed that staggered appointments of Council members would be better.

Role and Responsibility Score = 4.5

It was noted that Council does have a Risk Register however this needs to be reviewed by the Council in the near future.

Professional Practices Score = 5

Performance and Accountability Score = 4

Ministerial and Statutory Relationships Score = 3.5

To improve Council's rating it was noted that the Council needs to build better relationships and act as a key partner with the likes of the the Minsiter, the Planning Minister, the National Trust and the State Planning Commission.

Governance and Reporting Score = 4

It was noted the Council will work on its relationship with the Chief Executive.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Noted** that the Self-Assessment Tool needs to be submitted separately by each member to Mr David Hanna.
- **Discussed** and **Populated** the Maturity Evaluation Survey.
- **Agreed** to discuss the results with the new Council members at the meeting on 23 May 2024.

6.2 Discuss requirement for Heritage Protection Report

The role of Council in providing a report on trends, opportunities and threats to the Minister was noted.

The ninth Heritage Protection Report was provided to the Minister in October 2022 and a summary of its report was added to the Council's webpage.

Council agreed that the themes in the report are still relevant and that a new report would not be required. The Council determined to review the current report and refresh it if required, including a prioritisation of the themes.

Action: Establish a Working Group following the appointment of new Council members.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Noted** the progression towards the key themes of 9th Report on Heritage Protection.
- **Noted** that this report will be discussed when the Chair meets with the Deputy Premier.
- **Agreed** to review and update for 2024.
- **Considered and agreed** that a small working group would be established upon appointment of new Council to review and update the current report.

6.3 Review: Policy – Delegation of South Australian Heritage Council's Powers and Functions.

Council considered the review of this policy and agreed to add the following text to the third paragraph under the 'policy' heading: ".....but may seek or receive advice of a strategic nature from Heritage SA for the Council's consideration ..."

Council also requested that the following paragraph in the Procedure be moved into this Policy: "Delegations must not be exercised where a conflict of interest or a perceived conflict of interest exists. If there is such conflict, then the delegate must disclose the conflict to the Council and any such conflicts of interest the delegate believes are likely to arise in future."

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Reviewed** the Policy – Delegation of South Australian Heritage Council's Powers and Functions as per above text.
- **Noted** that the updated Policy will be made available on the Council's webpage.

6.4 Review: Procedure – Instrument of Delegation

Council discussed the revised Procedure and agreed with the suggested amendment to remove reference to the Register Committee, as well as removal of point f) "the period of time during which the delegation is to remain in force."

As per Item 6.3, the Council agreed that the last paragraph under “Exercise of delegations” be moved to the Policy and the word “should” be changed to “must” in the same paragraph.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Considered** the Procedure – Delegations.
- **Approved** the minor changes suggested in tracked changes as well as the further amendments described above.
- **Noted** that the Procedure will be made available on the Council’s webpage.

6.5 Review: Instrument of Delegation

Council reviewed its Instrument of Delegation and agreed to amend it by inserting a new #4 on page 1 as follows: “A delegation must not be exercised where a conflict of interest or a perceived conflict of interest exists. If there is such conflict, then the delegate must disclose the conflict to the Council and any such conflicts of interest the delegate believes are likely to arise in future.”

Council also agreed that the position of Manager, Heritage South Australia would be the appropriate delegate in relation to section 32(1) and 32(3) of the *Heritage Places Act 1993*: “Advise the Minister on entering into, varying or terminating a heritage agreement [relating only to the agreements known as Monarto heritage agreements entered into under section 16(a) of the Heritage Act 1978].”

It was noted that Heritage SA will review the information provided on forms 1 and 2 in relation to delegations, specifically archaeological designations and permit requirements.”

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Considered** the Instrument of Delegation and requested amendments as per above.
- **Noted** that the department will provide the Council with an opportunity to review the Instrument of Delegation at the first meeting of each calendar year.

6.6 Draft reply – letter from Queensland Heritage re Climate and Heritage matters

Ms Voigt provided an overview of the letter received from the Queensland Heritage Council. It suggests some questions that may be considered including whether value is

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seen in collecting data on climate change impact across jurisdictions, whether there is value in sharing material and/or documents, the composition of a possible working group and a possible submission to the review of the National Heritage Strategy.

It was noted that South Australia is represented on the Economic and Public Value Committee through Ms Voigt and Mr Blazeby.

It was noted that DEW, outside of the work of Heritage SA, already does a substantial amount of work on climate change and environmental impacts.

Council noted that the implications of climate change for heritage might be broader than disaster management and agreed with the proposal for information sharing, collective action and / or regular interaction with other jurisdictions on climate change.

It was noted that a response is requested by 28 February 2024 to be presented to a meeting of HCOANZ in March 2024.

Action: A draft response will be prepared for the Chair's approval.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Considered** the letter from the Queensland Heritage Council and Climate Resilience Working Group meeting record.
- **Agreed** with the proposal for information sharing, collective action and/or regular interaction with other jurisdictions on climate change.
- **Agreed** that climate change should be a topic at annual/biannual HCOANZ meetings.
- **Noted** that the Chair of the SA Heritage Council will arrange to meet with the Chair of the Climate Change Council, South Australia.

6.7 Review: Procedure – Provisional Entry of an Object

Council reviewed and approved the suggested amendments to the Procedure – Provisional Entry of an Object.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Approved** the amendments to Procedure – Provisional Entry of an Object.
- **Noted** that the updated Procedure will be made available on the Council's webpage.

6.8 Review: Procedure – Blue Plaques

Council agreed at its 6 July 2023 meeting to a funding program for blue plaques for Places confirmed on the South Australian Heritage Register from 1 July 2023.

Council considered a draft procedure relating to the manufacture and installation of the blue plaques for newly confirmed State Heritage Places. It was noted that some Local Council's already offer plaques to State Heritage Place owners. Heritage SA will work with Local Councils to ensure there is no duplication of plaque production in this regard.

Action: Council requested a breakdown of the full cost of manufacture, installation and lodgement of a development application.

Council reviewed the mock up template. Council endorsed the template with one suggested change – that the name of the State Heritage Place be enlarged.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Considered and Approved** the Procedure – Blue Plaque Installation
- **Noted** that the Procedure will be made available on the Council's webpage.

7 ITEMS TO BE CONSIDERED FOR PROVISIONAL ENTRY ON THE SA HERITAGE REGISTER

7.1 Haigh Mansions, 323 Esplanade, Henley Beach. On Kurna Country.

An Assessment of Haigh Mansions, 323 Esplanade, Henley Beach recommends that Haigh Mansions meets criteria (a) and (b) under s16 of the *Heritage Places Act 1993* for listing as a State Heritage Place.

A Summary of State Heritage Place and the Heritage Assessment Report were prepared for Council's consideration to determine whether Haigh Mansions should be provisionally entered as a State Heritage Place in the Register.

Council considered the assessment and agreed with the recommendations to provisionally enter the place under criteria a) and b) under s16 of the *Heritage Places Act 1993*.

Council endorsed the Summary of State Heritage Place.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Provisionally entered** Haigh Mansions, 323 Esplanade, Henley Beach in the South Australian Heritage Register as a State Heritage Place, as it is deemed to

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fulfil criteria (a) and (b) for State heritage listing under section 16(1) of the Heritage Places Act 1993:

(a) it demonstrates important aspects of the evolution or pattern of the State's history
and

(b) it has rare, uncommon or endangered qualities that are of cultural significance

- **Approved** the Summary of State Heritage Place for Haigh Mansions, 323 Esplanade, Henley Beach.

7.2 Nookamka No. 1 (Lake Bonney) Pumping Station (ruin), Barmera.

It was noted that Ms McDougall did not participate in discussions or decision making for this matter given that she had declared a conflict of interest.

On 7 November 2023, a nomination was received from a member of the public for the Nookamka No. 1 (Lake Bonney) Pumping Station Dam Wall Ruin, Lot 18, Queen Elizabeth Drive, Barmera. The nominator considered that the Nookamka No. 1 (Lake Bonney) Pumping Station Dam Wall Ruin meets criteria (a), (c), (f) and (g) under s16 of the *Heritage Places Act 1993* (the Act) for listing as a State Heritage Place in the South Australian Heritage Register.

Following an assessment by Heritage SA, it is recommended that the nomination does not meet any of the criteria for listing.

Council agreed with the assessment and rejected the nomination for listing as a State Heritage Place.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Rejected** the nomination for State-listing of the Nookamka No. 1 (Lake Bonney) Pumping Station Dam Wall Ruin, Lot 18, Queen Elizabeth Drive, Barmera (CR 6168/652 Allotment Pieces 18 and 19 D9422, Cobdogla Irrigation Area, Nookamka Division, Out of Hundreds), as it does not meet any of the s16 criteria in the *Heritage Places Act 1993*.

8 ITEM TO BE CONSIDERED FOR CONFIRMATION ON THE SA HERITAGE REGISTER

8.1 St Patrick's Schoolhouse, 268 Grote Street, Adelaide

It was noted that Mr Marcus Rolfe and Mrs Deb Lindsay departed the meeting at this point due to having declared a conflict of interest in relation to this matter.

On 17 August 2023, the South Australian Heritage Council (the Council) provisionally entered St Patrick's Schoolhouse in the South Australian Heritage Register (the Register) as a State Heritage Place as it meets criteria (a) and (b) under s16 of the *Heritage Places Act 1993*.

The period for making a public submission closed on 28 November 2023. No submissions were received.

The Summary of State Heritage Place for St Patrick's Church was presented for the Council's consideration and approval.

Council confirmed the entry of St Patrick's Schoolhouse in the South Australian Heritage Register and approved the Summary of State Heritage Place.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Confirmed** the entry of St Patrick's Schoolhouse, Kaurna Country, 268 Grote Street, Adelaide (CT 5604/216 F181133 A291 Hundred of Adelaide) in the South Australian Heritage Register as a State Heritage Place, pursuant to sections 18(4) & 18(5) of the *Heritage Places Act 1993* as it satisfies criterion (a) and (b) under section 16(1) of the Act:
 - (a) it demonstrates important aspects of the evolution or pattern of the State's history
 - (b) it has rare, uncommon or endangered qualities that are of cultural significance
- **Approved** the Summary of State Heritage Place

9 ITEMS TO BE CONSIDERED FOR DESIGNATION IN THE SA HERITAGE REGISTER

9.1 Hallett Cove Conservation Park & Sandison Reserve, Hallett Cove.

It was noted that Mr Rolfe and Mrs Lindsay returned to the meeting at this point.

On 4 November 2021, the South Australian Heritage Council entered an intent to designate Hallett Cove Conservation Park & Sandison Reserve in the South Australian Heritage Register as a place of palaeontological significance under section 14(7)(a) of the *Heritage Places Act 1993* (Act), providing special protections pursuant to Part 5 of the Act.

It was noted that Kurna Yerta Aboriginal Corporation (KYAC) had been consulted and they had provided feedback to Heritage SA staff that had been taken into consideration when finalising the designation report.

Council resolved to confirm the designation of Hallett Cove Conservation Park & Sandison Reserve and approved the Summary of State Heritage Place.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Confirmed** the designation of Hallett Cove Conservation Park & Sandison Reserve 14033 Clifftop Crescent, Hallett Cove 5158 CR 5428/687 H105500 S1577, CT 5546/805 F148355 A17, CR 5772/819 H105500 S1550, CR 5361/119 D2387 A1, CR 5361/120 D2387 A2, CR 5772/819 F28675 A20,21, Hundred of Noarlunga in the South Australian Heritage Register as a place of geological significance pursuant to section 14(7)(a) of the *Heritage Places Act 1993*.

9.2 Geological Monument – Myponga Beach Coastline, Myponga.

On 4 November 2021, the South Australian Heritage Council entered an intent to designate Geological Monument - Myponga Beach Coastline in the South Australian Heritage Register as a place of palaeontological significance under section 14(7)(a) of the *Heritage Places Act 1993*, providing special protections pursuant to Part 5 of the Act.

The period for making a submission closed on 11 February 2022. No submissions were received.

It was noted that correspondence had been sent to Kurna Yerta Aboriginal Corporation on three occasions as well as Heritage SA staff meeting with the Board to discuss this proposal. It was noted that if a late submission is provided by the Corporation following designation, this information would still be considered by the Council. The supporting information to the listing could be updated, if required, based on the information in the submission.

Council resolved to confirm the designation and the Summary of State Heritage Place document.
