MINUTES

The 147th Meeting of the South Australian Heritage Council (the Council) was held on Level 10, 81 – 95 Waymouth Street, Adelaide on Thursday 27 June 2024.

Statement of Acknowledgement

The Chairperson acknowledged that the land that the Council members meet on today is the traditional lands for Kaurna people and that the Council respect their spiritual relationship with their country. The Chairperson also acknowledged the Kaurna people as the custodians of the Adelaide region and that their cultural and heritage beliefs are still as important to the living Kaurna people today.

1. WELCOME AND APOLOGIES

Ms Verschoor welcomed all to the 147th meeting of the South Australian Heritage Council (the Council).

There were apologies from Mr David Brooks.

2. ADOPTION OF AGENDA AND DECLARATION OF CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Agenda

The agenda was adopted.

Declarations of conflict of interest

It was noted that Mrs Lindsay declared a conflict of interest in relation to the In-Camera discussion matter.

It was noted that Ms Toft declared a conflict of interest with Item 7.1, St David's Anglican Church, Burnside, given that she had been involved with this property through her work at Burnside Local Council.

3 PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES

It was noted that some minor grammatical changes were provided to Mr Hanna and, subject to those changes being made, the minutes were approved.

RESOLUTION:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Approved** the minutes of 23 May 2024 subject to the above.

4. ACTION ITEMS

The Council noted the status of action items.

Ms Verschoor noted that she was keen to progress the joint meeting with the State Aboriginal Heritage Committee and would discuss the timing of this meeting with Mr Hanna out of session.

RESOLUTION

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Noted** the status of the action list.

5. IN CAMERA DISCUSSION

The Council had an in-camera discussion pursuant to section 7 (6) of the *Heritage Places Act 1993*.

The Council approved the following text for release at its 14 August 2025 meeting.

5.1 Letter from Mr Cawthorne regarding the Freemasons, North Terrace, Adelaide

Mr Michael Queale, Heritage SA, was welcomed to the meeting. Mr Queale noted he has provided advice in relation to the development proposal for this place as Delegate to the Minister responsible for the administration of the *Heritage Places Act 1993*.

It was noted that the South Australian Heritage Council does not have a role in development proposal advice and decision making.

Action: A letter of reply to Mr Cawthorne will be prepared by Mr Hanna for the Chairperson's consideration.

RESOLUTIONS

The South Australian Heritage Council:

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- **Noted** the advice provided by Heritage SA in relation to the status of the Development Application for the Grand Lodge of Freemasons.
- **Noted** that it does not have a statutory role in development proposal advice and decision making, pertaining to a State Heritage Place. This is the role of the Minister and or their delegate.
- **Noted** that a draft reply will be prepared for the Chair to approve out of session, based on the advice above.

5.2 St John Vianney's Catholic Church – Court Appeal

The Council discussed the progress of this Court Appeal with departmental staff Ms Kym Pryde, Mr Leonard Blazeby and Ms Beverley Voigt.

RESOLUTIONS

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Requested** that DEW provide advice to better delineate the decision making between section 16 (1)(d) and section 16 (1)(e).
- **Requested** that DEW explore in greater detail the use of steel in structures in the relevant period.
- **Consider** requesting CSO advice to understand if a new criteria could be considered if the matter was to go to trial.

6 ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION / DECISION**6.1 Portable building presentation**

Mr Miles Lewis was welcomed to the meeting. Mr Lewis was accompanied by Ms Janet Breston, Mr Tony Isaacson and Mr Andrew Muir, members of the Portable Buildings Task Force.

Mr Lewis provided a presentation that featured a selection of the hundred plus portable buildings that were imported to Australia in the nineteenth century.

Mr Lewis concluded by requesting the Council provide a letter of support for World Heritage Listing of Portable Buildings to the Federal Environment Minister.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Noted** the presentation provided by Mr Miles Lewis on Portable Buildings
- **Noted** it would seek further information about the Portable Building World Heritage Bid proposal in relation to South Australian buildings.

- **Agreed** it would not write a letter of support in relation to the World Heritage bid for Portable Buildings at this point in time.

6.2 Flinders Ranges World Heritage bid presentation

Mr Jason Irving was welcomed to the meeting.

Mr Irving provided an insightful presentation to the Council. It was noted that the bid is well advanced in its preparation. World Heritage status is sought against Criterion (viii) with the following description provided: 'The Flinders Ranges is an outstanding example representing major stages of earth's history, including the record of life: that is the evolution of complex, multicellular animal life.'

It was noted that the Flinders Ranges is the only place known on Earth where two great experiments in the evolution of complex multicellular animal life – the Ediacaran radiation event and the Cambrian explosion of life – outcrop in a near-continuous geological succession.

Next steps include gaining full agreement with the Adynthanamantha people and completion of the dossier.

Ms Sandy Verschoor thanked Mr Irving for the presentation.

RESOLUTION:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Noted** the presentation on the Flinders Ranges World Heritage bid.

6.3 Arkaroola and Koonalda Caves

Dr Louise Bird noted that on 4 November 2021, Arkaroola Protection Area (SHP 26404) and Koonalda Cave (SHP 14250) were identified for consideration for designation as a part of the Fossil Heritage Survey, presented to the Council.

Dr Bird recommended that the designation of Arkaroola Protection Area and Koonalda Caves is paused given the shared aim in DEW of protecting the geological significance of these places while at the same time progressing the bid for World Heritage status for the Flinders Ranges.

It was noted that Heritage SA is scheduling a meeting with the Sprigg family to discuss Arkaroola and possible designation.

Dr Bird noted the permit obligations for a designated State Heritage Place and the need for improved coordination of DEW scientific permits and s25 and s26 geological, paleontological and speleological permits.

Council agreed with the recommendations put forward by Heritage SA.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Agreed** not to designate Arkaroola Protection Area SHP 26404 at this point in time and requested a progress report within 12 months of this meeting.
- **Agreed** not to designate Koonalda Cave SHP 14250 at this point in time and requested a progress report within 12 months of this meeting.
- **Noted** that if the situation changes and designation to protect either State Heritage Place becomes necessary, the matter will be brought to the Council's attention for decision on an appropriate action.
- **Approved** delaying consideration and dissemination of the SSHP BHI Koonalda Cave until after the Koonalda Cave Conservation Management plan has been published.

6.4 For Review – Policy: Public availability of information on provisional entries, confirmation and removal of entries in the South Australian Heritage Register.

Council reviewed this Policy and agreed with the suggested amendments put forward by Heritage SA.

RESOLUTION:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Approved** the suggested amendments to the Policy.

6.5 For Review – Procedure: Confirmation or Removal of Provisional Entries in the South Australian Heritage Register

Council reviewed this Procedure and agreed with the suggested amendments put forward by Heritage SA.

RESOLUTION:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Approved** the suggested amendments to the Procedure.

6.6 Guideline: Confirmation or Removal of Provisional Entry in the South Australian Heritage Register

Council reviewed this guideline and agreed with the suggested amendments put forward by Heritage SA.

RESOLUTION:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Approved** the suggested changes to Guideline: Confirmation or Removal of Provisional Entry in the South Australian Heritage Register.

6.7 Guideline: Extension of Provisional Listing

Council reviewed this guideline and agreed with the suggested amendments put forward by Heritage SA.

RESOLUTION:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Approved** the suggested changes to the Guideline: Extension of Provisional Listing

6.8 Guideline: Certificate of Exclusion

Council reviewed this Guideline and approved the suggested amendments subject to some minor changes provided to Mr Hanna. Council noted that this combines two previous Guidelines into one document.

RESOLUTION:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Approved** the suggested changes to the Guideline: Certificate of Exclusion, subject to minor changes.

6.9 Localities to consider for State Heritage Area recognition

It was noted that the creation of a State Heritage Area is a planning process achieved by initiating a code amendment to add a State Heritage Area to the State Heritage Area Overlay. Code amendments are approved by the Minister for Planning.

It was noted that the last State Heritage Area to be created is the Mount Torrens State Heritage Area which was established on 5 December 2002.

On 6 December 2018, the Council 'agreed to recommend the Adelaide Park Lands for heritage listing as a State Heritage Area' commencing the process soon after. To date the Park Lands remains unlisted as a State Heritage Area.

In the paper provided to the Council, a list of localities had been identified as possible State Heritage Areas for consideration.

Council discussed the paper and noted that Code Amendments can be initiated by the Council, but the cost is borne by the initiator.

Ms Kym Pryde noted there might be an opportunity for the Council to identify State Heritage Areas through input into the Regional Planning Process.

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It was suggested that discussions are held with Planning and Land Use Services about what could be included in a consultation draft for a regional plan.

Action: Ms Pryde to ask Planning Land Use Services what the order of preparation of the regional plans will be.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Noted** the content of the paper provided.
- **Requested** the preparation of flow chart to map the complexity of creating a new State Heritage Area to understand the potential of streamlining the listing and code amendment processes.
- **Requested** a list of timing of consultation on Regional Plans in SA, so that they can be considered in turn for possible identification of State Heritage Areas.

6.10 Updated Statements of Significance for State Heritage Areas

This action is proposed in accordance with Section 14 of the *Heritage Places Act 1993*:

(6) The Council may include other information in the Register, or hold other information in association with the Register, as the Council thinks fit.

Council considered the updated Statements of Significance for the following seven State Heritage Areas:

- Beltana
- Mount Gambier Cave Gardens and Civic Centre
- Mount Gambier Volcanic Complex
- Mount Schank
- Mount Torrens
- Port Adelaide
- Mintaro

Council also approved the 'known as' names for the two Mount Gambier State Heritage Areas. It was noted that a dual naming policy is being prepared for Council to consider later in 2024.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Approved** the new Statements of Heritage Significance for the 7 State Heritage Areas, identified in Attachment A and in the table at sentence 7.
- **Approved** the new Details (known as) names for the two Mount Gambier State Heritage Areas:

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- a. Mount Gambier Thugi/Cave Gardens and Civic Centre State Heritage Area
- b. Mount Gambier Volcanic Complex State Heritage Area

7 ITEMS TO BE CONSIDERED FOR PROVISIONAL ENTRY ON THE SA HERITAGE REGISTER

7.1 St David's Anglican Church, Kaurna Country, 492 Glynburn Road, Burnside

Mr Burns was welcomed to the meeting. Mr Burns noted that the St David's Anglican Church, 492 Glynburn Road, Burnside was first identified for assessment through the Postwar Places of Worship project and was added to the Assessment List on 13 August 2020.

On 26 May 2023, a member of the public also nominated St David's Anglican Church, for listing as a State Heritage Place in the South Australian Heritage Register as they believe it meets criteria (a), (b), (d), (e), (f) and (g) under s16 of the *Heritage Places Act 1993* (the Act).

The assessment recommends that the church meets criterion (e) under s16 of the *Heritage Places Act 1993* (the Act) for listing as a State Heritage Place.

It was noted that Mr Chris Burns undertook a full site visit on 20 March 2024. A Summary of State Heritage Place and the Heritage Assessment Report have been prepared for Council's consideration to determine whether St David's Anglican Church should be provisionally entered as a State Heritage Place in the Register.

It was noted there are many Churches dedicated as Memorials. Most of the big Churches were dedicated as War Memorials – usually a plaque inside the Church.

Council considered the assessment report and agreed to provisionally enter St David's Anglican Church under criterion (e). Council approved the Summary of State Heritage Place without amendment.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Provisionally entered** St David's Anglican Church, Kaurna Country, 492 Glynburn Road, Burnside (CT 5636/681 A48 FP141609 Hundred of Adelaide) in the South Australian Heritage Register as a State Heritage Place, as it is deemed to fulfil criterion (e) for State heritage listing under section 16(1) of the *Heritage Places Act 1993*:

(e) it demonstrates a high degree of creative, aesthetic or technical accomplishment or is an outstanding representative of particular construction techniques or design characteristics.

- **Approved** the Summary of State Heritage Place for the St David's Anglican Church, 492 Glynburn Road, Burnside.

7.2 Sandergrove Water Reserve, Peramangk and Ngarrindjeri Country, Wattle Flat Road, Sandergrove.

Ms Jade Kanas was welcomed to the meeting. It was noted that on 27 July 2021, the South Australian Heritage Council received a public nomination for Sandergrove Water Reserve, Wattle Flat Road, Sandergrove SA 5255. The nominator believed that Sandergrove Water Reserve, meets criteria (a) and (e) of s16 of the *Heritage Places Act 1993* for listing as a State Heritage Place in the South Australian Heritage Register.

Ms Jade Kanas and Dr Louise Bird undertook a full site visit on 4 December 2023. An Assessment for the Sandergrove Water Reserve recommends that the Reserve fulfils criterion (a) under s16 of the Act for listing as a State Heritage Place.

Council discussed the assessment report including the boundary of the watercourse. It was noted that the well and trough are fenced.

Council agreed to provisionally enter this place under criterion (a). Council approved the Summary of State Heritage Place.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Provisionally entered** Sandergrove Water Reserve, Peramangk and Ngarrindjeri Country, Wattle Flat Road, Sandergrove Sa 5255 (CR 5763/647 S89, Hundred of Kondoparinga) in the South Australian Heritage Register as a State Heritage Place, as it is deemed to fulfil criteria (a) for State Heritage listing under section 16(1) of the *Heritage Places Act 1993*:
 - (a) it demonstrates important aspects of the evolution or pattern of the State's history,
- **Approved** the Summary of State Heritage Place for Sandergrove Water Reserve, Wattle Flat Road, Sandergrove SA 5255.

7.3 Lime Kilns, Ngarrindjeri Country, Green Farm Village, Monarto

It was noted that on 3 February 2023, the South Australian Heritage Council received a public nomination for Bretag/Green Farm Complex, Monarto Safari Park, 63 Monarto Road, Monarto as a State Heritage Place in the South Australian Heritage Register for listing under all seven criteria under s16 of the *Heritage Places Act 1993*.

It was noted that Ms Jade Kanas and Dr Louise Bird undertook a full site visit on 4 December 2023.

An Assessment Report has been prepared and recommends that Bretag/Green Farm Complex is not considered to meet any of the s16 criteria of the Act for listing as a State Heritage Place.

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The Assessment Report considers that the Lime Kilns within the complex meets s16 criteria (b) and (d) of the Act for listing as a State Heritage Place.

A Summary of State Heritage Place and Heritage Assessment Report were prepared for the Council's consideration in relation to the Lime Kilns.

Ms Kanas noted that in comparison to other State heritage listed lime kilns that those at Monarto are more intact, however, some of the existing listed kilns better demonstrate the other elements associated with the complex of structures used to manufacture lime.

The Council agreed to a name change to 'Green Farm Lime Kilns, Monarto' and to the addition of some information about the clearing of the land and subsequent usage of the cleared stones. It was also agreed that the history subheadings would be reordered to ensure that the Summary of State Heritage Place focusses more on lime kilns rather than mixed farming.

Noted that in future, reference to "man-made" would be changed to a gender-neutral term.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Provisionally Entered** Green Farm Lime Kilns, Ngarrindjeri Country, Monarto, Monarto Safari Park, 63 Monarto Road, Monarto 5254 (CT 6297/539 D122491 A11, Hundreds of Mobilong and Monarto) in the South Australian Heritage Register as a State Heritage Place, as it is deemed to fulfil criteria (b) and (d) for State Heritage listing under section 16(1) of the *Heritage Places Act 1993*:
 - (b) it has rare, uncommon or endangered qualities that are of cultural significance,
 - (d) it is an outstanding representative of a particular class of place of cultural significance.
- **Approved** the Summary of State Heritage Place for Green Farm Lime Kilns, Monarto, Monarto Safari Park, 63 Monarto Road, Monarto 5254.
- **Considered and Rejected** the balance of the nominated places at the Green Farm Complex.

7.4 Tribute to James Cyril Stobie, Kaurna Country, Angle Park

Dr Thomas Mackay noted that on 5 August 2021, the South Australian Heritage Council rejected the nomination for AESCo Transformer (Holland Street) and added the tribute to James Cyril Stobie at Angle Park and the Kelvin Building, North Terrace, Adelaide to the Assessment List.

It was noted that on 16 May 2024, Dr Thomas Mackay undertook a site visit of the Tribute.

OFFICIAL

An assessment of the tribute to James Cyril Stobie (the Tribute) recommends that the tribute meets criteria (a), (e) and (g) under s16 of the *Heritage Places Act 1993* for listing as a State Heritage Place.

A Summary of State Heritage Place and the Heritage Assessment Report were provided for Council's consideration to determine whether the Tribute should be provisionally entered as a State Heritage Place in the Register.

It was noted that 2024 is the 100th anniversary of the stobie pole. Dr Mackay spoke to the high level of public interest in the stobie pole including the popularity of an event at the SA History Festival.

Council agreed to provisionally enter the Tribute to James Cyril Stobie under criteria (a), (e) and (g). Council approved the Summary of State Heritage Place without any changes.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Provisionally entered** Tribute to James Cyril Stobie, Kaurna Country, 500 Grand Junction Road, Angle Park (CT 6170/399, D72468 A207; Hundred of Yatala) in the South Australian Heritage Register as a State Heritage Place, as it is deemed to fulfil criteria (a), (e) and (g) for State heritage listing under section 16(1) of the *Heritage Places Act 1993*:
 - (a) it demonstrates important aspects of the evolution or pattern of the State's history
 - (e) it demonstrates a high degree of creative, aesthetic or technical accomplishment or is an outstanding representative of particular construction techniques or design characteristics.
 - (g) it has a special association with the life or work of a person or organisation or an event of historical importance.
- **Approved** the Summary of State Heritage Place for Tribute to James Cyril Stobie, 500 Grand Junction Road, Angle Park.

8 ITEMS TO BE CONSIDERED FOR CONFIRMATION ON THE SA HERITAGE REGISTER

8.1 Honour Board, Kaurna Country, Torrens Building, 202-220 Tarntanyangga / Victoria Square, Adelaide SA 5000

It was noted that Ms Sandy Verschoor departed the meeting at this point and Ms Eleanor Walters assumed the role of Chairperson.

Ms Walters introduced this item and acknowledged Ms Marigold Francis, the nominator, who was present in the public gallery.

Ms Walters invited Ms Jade Kanas to summarise the matter.

Ms Kanas noted that on 7 December 2023, the Council provisionally entered the Commissioner of Public Works Honour Board (Honour Board), as a State Heritage Object intrinsically related to the heritage significance of the Torrens Building (SHP 10895), 202-220 Tarntanyangga / Victoria Square, Adelaide SA 5000, in the South Australian Heritage Register (the Register) under section 14(2)(b) of the *Heritage Places Act 1993*.

At the time of provisional entry, the Council agreed to add further information to the Summary of State Heritage Object regarding the inclusion of First Nations personnel on the Honour Board. This information has been added to the Summary of State Heritage Object using track changes.

The period for making a public submission closed on 18 March 2024. One submission was received in support of State Heritage listing.

A revised Summary of State Heritage Object for the Honour Board is presented for the Council's consideration and approval.

The Council discussed the Aboriginal service personnel who were honoured through listing on the Honour Board.

The Council confirmed the entry of the Honour Board as a State Heritage Object and approved the Summary of State Heritage Object with including the proposed changes.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Confirmed** the entry of the Commissioner of Public Works Honour Board as a State Heritage Object intrinsically related to the heritage significance of the Torrens Building, Kurna Country, 202-220 Tarntanyangga / Victoria Square, Adelaide SA 5000 (CT 5896/686 D27841 A5, Hundred of Adelaide) (SHP 10895) in the South Australian Heritage Register, pursuant to sections 18(4) & 18(5) of the *Heritage Places Act 1993*.
- **Approved** the Summary of State Heritage Object for the Commissioner of Public Works Honour Board, including suggested amendments.

8.2 Haigh Mansions, Kurna Country, 323 Esplanade, Henley Beach

Mr Burns provide an overview. It was noted that on 15 February 2024, the South Australian Heritage Council provisionally entered Haigh Mansions in the South Australian Heritage Register as a State Heritage Place as it meets criteria (a) and (b) under s16 of the *Heritage Places Act 1993*.

The period for making a public submission closed on 23 May 2024. One submission was received, it is both opposed to and supportive of State Heritage listing.

OFFICIAL

The Summary of State Heritage Place for Haigh Mansions was provided for the Council's consideration and final approval.

It was noted that the submission had recommended that the garage and laundry block be removed the heritage listing. Since the garage and laundry block demonstrates important aspects of the modern lifestyle associated with interwar flats, it is recommended that the Council does not exclude the garage and laundry block from the extent of listing.

The Council discussed the submission at length with respect to whether to exclude the garage and laundry block.

The Council concluded that Haigh Mansions should be confirmed in the Register under criteria (a) and (b) and that the associated garage and laundry block should remain within the extent of listing.

It was noted that the colours of the façade do not reflect the original colours of Haigh Mansions.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Considered** the submission received in relation to the entry of Haigh Mansions in the South Australian Heritage Register;
- **Confirmed** the entry of Haigh Mansions, Kurna Country, 323 Esplanade, Henley Beach (CT 5280/561 A200 D31903 Hundred of Yatala) in the South Australian Heritage Register as a State Heritage Place, pursuant to sections 18(4) & 18(5) of the *Heritage Places Act 1993* as it satisfies criteria (a) and (b) under section 16(1) of the Act:
 - (a) it demonstrates important aspects of the evolution or pattern of the State's history
 - (b) it has rare, uncommon or endangered qualities that are of cultural significance
- **Approved** the Summary of State Heritage Place.

8.3 Shandon (flats), Kurna Country, 88 Moseley Street, Glenelg South.

On 7 December 2023, the South Australian Heritage Council provisionally entered Shandon (flats) in the South Australian Heritage Register as a State Heritage Place as it meets criteria (a), (b), (d) and (e) under s16 of the *Heritage Places Act 1993*.

The period for making a public submission closed on 12 April 2024. Four submissions were received in support of State Heritage listing and were provided to Council members for consideration.

The Summary of State Heritage Place for Shandon (flats) was provided for the Council's consideration and approval.

Council confirmed the entry of Shandon (flats) and approved the Summary of State Heritage Place without amendment.

RESOLUTIONS:

The South Australian Heritage Council:

- **Confirmed** the entry of Shandon (flats), Kaurna Country, 88 Moseley Street, Glenelg South (CT 5014/565 S6681 U1; CT 5014/566 S6681 U2; CT 5014/567 S6681 U3; CT 5014/568 S6681 U4; CT 5014/569 S6681 UCP; Hundred of Noarlunga) in the South Australian Heritage Register as a State Heritage Place, pursuant to sections 18(4) & 18(5) of the *Heritage Places Act 1993* as it satisfies criterion (a), (b), (d) and (e) under section 16(1) of the Act:
 - (a) it demonstrates important aspects of the evolution or pattern of the State's history
 - (b) it has rare, uncommon or endangered qualities that are of cultural significance
 - (d) it is an outstanding representative of a particular class of place of cultural significance
 - (e) it demonstrates a high degree of creative, aesthetic or technical accomplishment or is an outstanding representative of particular construction techniques or design characteristics
- **Approved** the Summary of State Heritage Place for Shandon (Flats), 88 Moseley Street, Glenelg South.

9 BETTER HERITAGE INFORMATION

Dr Louise Bird noted that Heritage South Australia has prepared additional information for three State Heritage Places at this meeting and these reports had been provided to Council members with their agenda package.
