a) it demonstrates important aspects of the evolution or pattern of the State's history	The former Sisalkraft Factory complex is emblematic of the huge post WW2 industrial expansion of South Australia that transformed the state in terms of its economy, its demography, built environment and political complexion. The origins of the factory as a joint US-Australian enterprise typifies the funding and business development of South Australian industry post 1945 which was heavily financed and driven by significant American capital investment, often in partnership with local firms. Equally important the Architect, Keith Neighbour in keeping with the ethos of the emerging mid-century South Australian Regional School, adopted the prevailing International Style to meet the local environmental, social and technological conditions of the state in his design and construction methods of the Sisalkraft Factory complex.

d) it is an outstanding representative of a particular class of places of cultural significance	 The former Sisalkraft Factory possesses several characteristics that make it an outstanding representative of a particular class of places. These may be summarized as follows: The Factory's design contains significant attributes of the post WW2 International Style in its full flowering as the principal architectural movement of the mid-20th century. The integration of all of the Factory's components, showroom, manufacturing facilities and administration into a single complex. The careful attention paid to the corporate landscaping for both the Factory' staff and its customers together with a stress on carparking that reflects the primacy of the automobile as the main means of transport for the general public during this era.

- The deployment of highly visible architectural features to promote business such as the entrance's parabolic arch, signage and extensive landscaping.
- The employment of contemporary building technologies in the construction of this factory complex such as Besser blocks, Sisalkraft related materials for insulation and glass panels.
- Keith Neighbour's holistic approach to each part of the factory complex to present a totally unified and coherent design and appearance across the entire Sisalkraft Factory site including the landscaping and carparking.

e) it demonstrates a high degree of creative, aesthetic or technical accomplishment or is an outstanding representative of particular construction techniques or design characteristics

The Sisalkraft Factory represents one of the most important and imaginative designs of Keith Neighbour, an acknowledged leader of the post 1945 mid-century regional school of architecture in South Australia.

The edifice has many of the key traits of the International Style at its peak yet adjusted to the regional climatic conditions of South Australia. These include:

- Large areas of glass installed as window panels
- The cubic proportions of the building's general shape
- The eye catching parabolic arched entrance canopy
- Sisalation ceiling and floor insulation tailored with SA's climate in mind.
- The use of the then very contemporary Besser block masonry for curtain walls.
- External sun and shade control features on the southern side of the complex.
