

Permission to enter land for the purpose of taking protected animals in accordance with a Permit to Take Protected Animals from the Wild

Any person wishing to take protected animals from the wild must apply for a Permit to Take Protected Animals from the Wild and provide evidence of permission to enter land for this purpose at the time of application. Permit applicants can nominate other persons to take the protected animals or eggs on the nominated property. These persons must be nominated on the permit application and listed on the Permit to Take Protected Animals from the Wild (if granted) and comply with all limitations, restrictions, and conditions of the permit.

Under Section 64 of the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1972* (the Act), it is a criminal offence to be on any land for the purpose of taking a protected animal, or the eggs of a protected animal, unless that person has the written permission of the landowner to be on the land for that purpose. The Act specifies that the written permission must have been given not more than six months beforehand.

This form may be completed by a landowner or occupier to give written permission for a person to take protected animals from the wild on the property they own or occupy for the purpose specified below.

<p>This permission remains in force for a period not exceeding six months from the date signed on this form, subject to the following requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A Permit to Take Protected Animals from the Wild has been granted by the Department for Environment and Water for the location, species and purpose stated above. • If the permission is provided with less than 6 months remaining before permit expiry, then the permission expires at the same time as the Permit to Take Protected Animals from the Wild. • The permission remains in force until the quantity of protected animals authorised by the permit have been taken from the wild, • The person giving the permission remains the landowner or occupier of the land. • This permission is immediately withdrawn if the Department for Environment and Water refuses or cancels a Permit to Take Protected Animals from the Wild.

As the landowner/occupier of the land you may have additional requirements that must be met by the person(s) you are granting permission to. Examples:

- notifying you prior to entering the land when they will take protected animals from the wild
- leaving property gates as they were found (i.e., open or closed)
- exclusion areas on the property.
