#### 1. Welcome and Introductions

- Steve Dangerfield welcomed everyone to the meeting noting apologies and proxies.
- Steve reminded everyone about the meeting protocols.
- Steve highlighted the meeting purpose, agenda items and confirmed the actions from the previous meeting noting the previous meeting summary notes were finalised and will be published on the department's website.
- Steve discussed email protocols and it was agreed that CRG members email addresses would be included on the Terms of Reference and this document would be redistributed to the group. It was agreed that only business related to the CRG would be discussed with members across emails and all other matters would be discussed separately between groups *refer to email protocols slide* 4
- Steve noted that the Phase 2 impact assessment will be discussed in more detail at the next meeting to allow more time for members to read it.
- Steve introduced Chris Gibson from EBS Ecology.

#### 2. Project update

- James Guy provided a recap on the Securing the future of our coastline project objectives *refer to slide 8.*
- James provided an update on the Interim Replenishment works refer to slide 9.
- James provided a photographic presentation of the recent storm surge event that occurred on 24<sup>th</sup> June demonstrating how sand movement works assist in absorbing storm energy and protecting the foreshore *refer to slides 10 to 25*.
- James provided an update on external sand noting that delivery into West Beach is due late July / early August *refer to slide 26*.

#### 3. Draft Pipeline design

#### Flora and Fauna Assessment

- Chris Gibson gave a brief overview of the methodology, some key findings and recommendations covered in the recent flora and fauna assessment undertaken by EBS Ecology, noting that the report is in early draft development *refer to EBS presentation attached*.
- Steve Dangerfield noted that the final EBS report will accompany the pipeline development application (DA).
- Steve noted that the pipeline alignment is still in a conceptual design phase and the flora and fauna assessment along with CRG members' input and other assessments such as the recent ground assessments and upcoming cultural heritage surveys will all inform the final pipeline alignment and infrastructure placement.
- Steve noted that the EBS Ecology assessment was conducted for a corridor along the conceptual pipeline alignment, not the full width of the foreshore.

#### Draft phase 2 Impact Assessment

- James reiterated the purpose of the independent Phase 2 Impact Assessment was to review the long term impacts of recycling sand using a pipeline, noting the purpose was not to determine if the pipeline project should go ahead or not.
- James addressed all questions within the impact assessment scope that were raised by the CRG members following Doug Lord's initial briefing presentation at the meeting held May 18<sup>th</sup> *refer to slide 29 and scoping document as previously emailed to the group.*.
- James addressed all questions that were not within the impact assessment scope that were raised by the CRG members following Doug Lord's initial briefing presentation at the meeting held May 18<sup>th</sup> – refer to slides 30 and 31.
- James provided an overview of some of the key recommendations of the draft report *refer to slides* 32 to 34.

• Steve noted that the Phase 2 Impact Assessment draft report will be discussed in more detail at the next CRG meeting.
