<b>Description of the nominated place or object and its current condition:</b>	There are several items of historical significance located on this parcel of land and neighbouring properties. <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. <b>The Ruins of the Travellers Inn (stables still standing)</b></li><li>2. <b>Remains of Christoph Krueger's House (an Elder of the first Lutheran Church, Blumberg)</b></li><li>3. <b>Remains of a swing bridge over the River Torrens</b></li><li>4. <b>The site of the original Lutheran Church at Blumberg</b></li><li>5. <b>A cemetery containing the remains of the first settlers of Birdwood (10 names are identified on a plaque in the location)</b></li></ol>

Yes, there is a high chance that other ruins or artifacts could be located in the area as this is believed, by locals, to be the site of the first settlement of the town of Blumberg.

<b>Current use of the place or object:</b>	Primary Production on Watershed land – sheep are currently run on the property.

<b>Are there any current or long term threats to the nominated place or object?</b>	Yes. A solar station has just been approved by the Adelaide Hills Council to be built on the land.
<b>Name of Builder:</b>	Tetris Energy Pty Ltd
<b>Any other information:</b>	Development Application Number 20/530/473 78 oppositions were sent to council to oppose the development. A Council Assessment Panel meeting occurred on 21 <sup>st</sup> October 2020 and approval was granted from the panel for the build to go ahead. Although major concerns for the heritage importance of this land were raised, the CAP stated that they were not listed as state or local heritage places and so this argument carried little weight.

## D. Heritage Significance

### 7. Statement of State Significance - Why is the place or object important to South Australia?

These places are of state significance because it is believed to be the location of the first settlement of Blumberg (Birdwood). This town was settled in the mid 1840s by the second wave of German immigrants. Along with their brilliant workmanship, they brought with them their strong Lutheran faith. I believe the stables that currently exist (as a part of the original inn) could be an example of the workmanship of these early German settlers. Christoph Krueger was an elder of the first Lutheran Church at Blumberg and there is a plaque indicating the remains of his house. The cemetery contains the remains of 10 first German settlers, the first burial being of 7 year old Juliane Huebner in 1848. When viewing all items on a map, it is clear to see the connection between all items of this small settlement. These places can also be linked to the placement of the current Lutheran Church as this has been built in close proximity to the settlement.

| <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> <b>It demonstrates important aspects of the evolution or pattern of the State's history.</b>  | The Germans that settled in Birdwood were second/third wave settlers from North West Germany (not East Germany like other settlements in the area) and brought with them a different way of farming. This is quite different to the way of farming that had originally occurred with German settlement in neighbouring areas. In Blumberg, farming land was much larger and settlements more spread out. This parcel of land continues to be owned by a member of the Rathjen family. Although the change in way of farming occurred, this site still demonstrates the importance of the Lutheran faith to the people who settled here. |

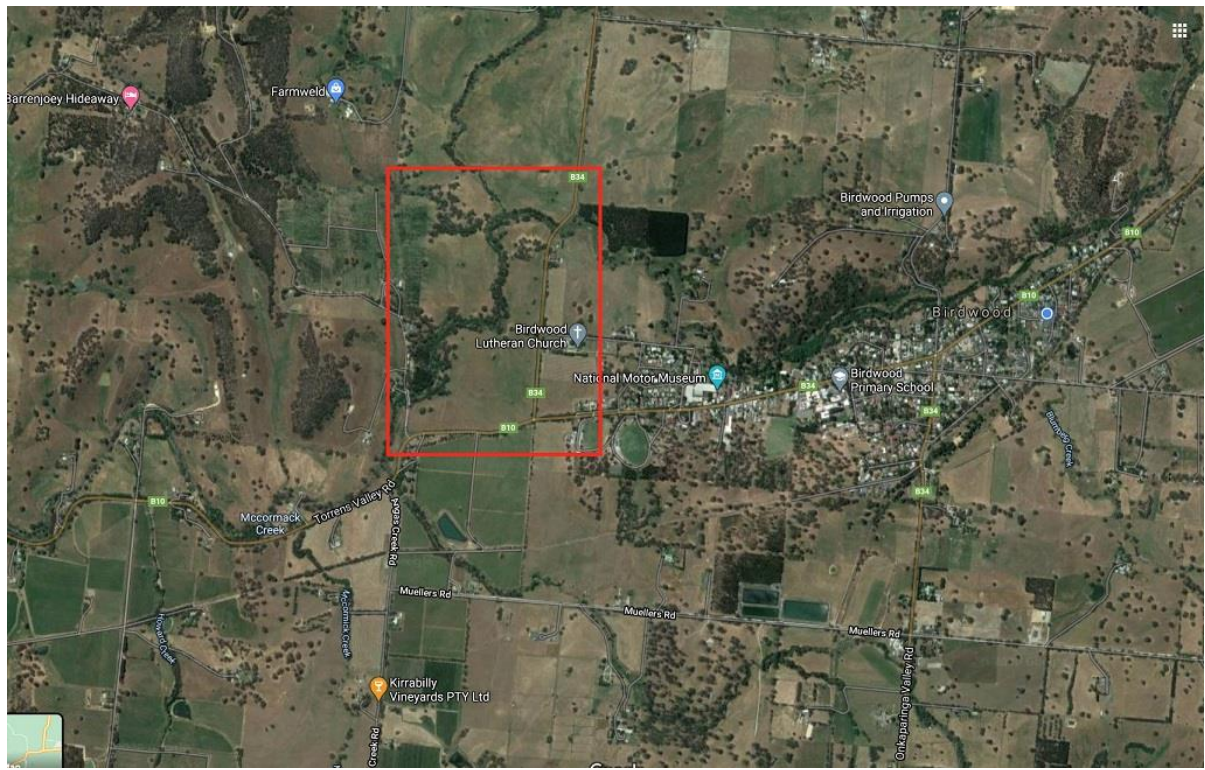

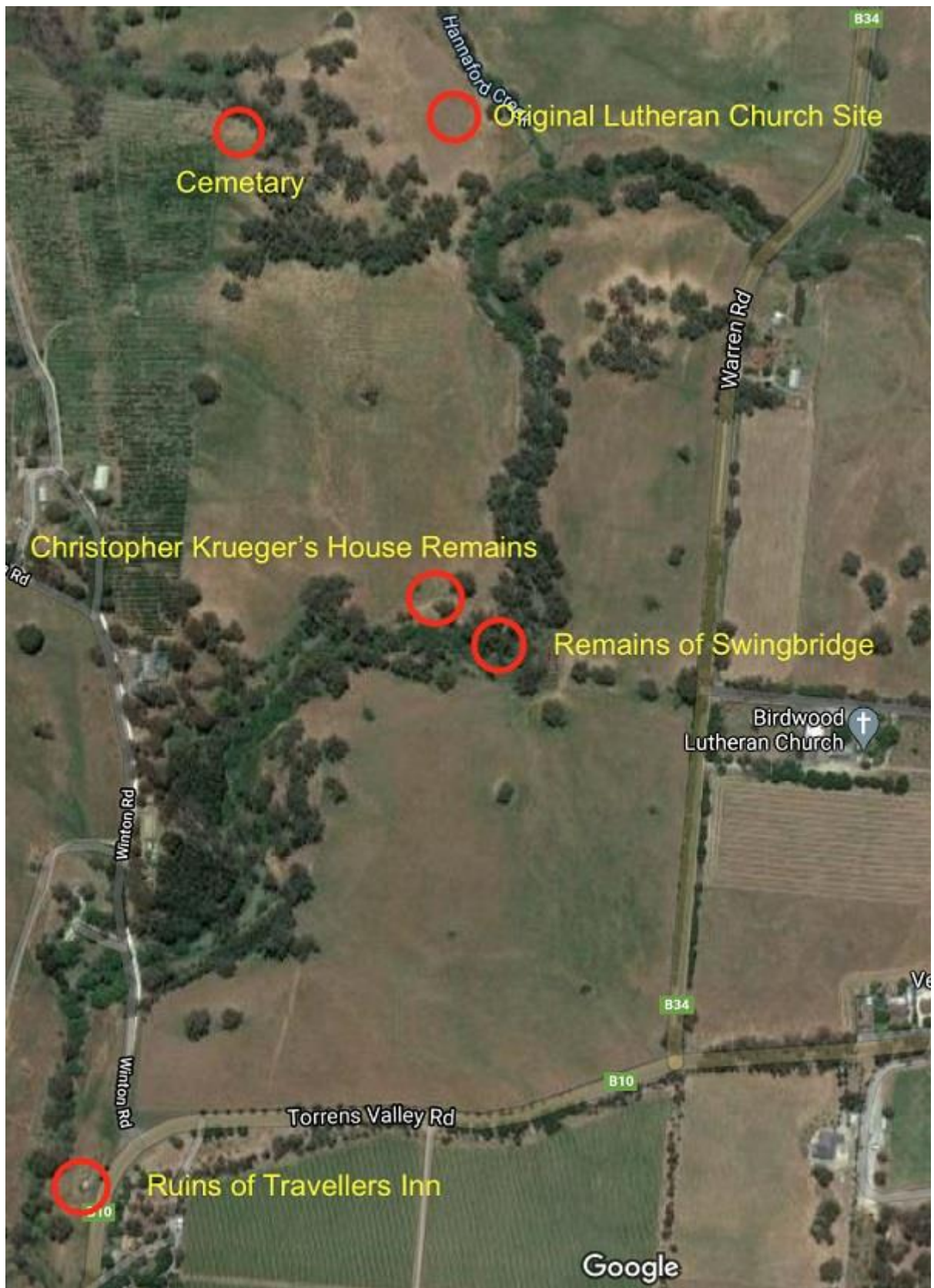

<b>HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE</b> <p>In December 1853 Johann Gottlob Blümel sold 3½ acres of land in the north western corner of Section 6586 to Johann Gottlieb Kalms, Johann Gottlieb Hoffman and Samuel Mueller "upon trust to permit an Evangelical Lutheran Church, schoolhouse and residence to be erected there-on". The Holy Cross Evangelical Lutheran Church was built on this site in 1860 and it now forms part of an attractive group of stone buildings which are laid out in a square around a large oak tree. Each of these buildings represents a different style. The original portion of the manse is the only one to reflect the German origins of early congregation, although this small cottage has since been enlarged by a villa end and rear additions. The church itself is in an ecclesiastical Gothic style, while the school building opposite is of a simple classical design. The fourth building of this group is the teacher's residence which is a typical late nineteenth century colonial house built of stone with brick detailing. ## Churches

For the first two years of settlement Lutheran Church services were held in the home of Mr Kruger, but in 1850 a church was built in the north-western corner of Section 6598. A small cemetery was located nearby and 10 people were buried here between July 1848 and July 1854. In December 1853 Johann Gottlob Bluemel sold 3½ acres in the north-western corner of Section 6586 to Johann Gottlieb Kalms, Johann Gottlieb Hoffmann and Samuel Mueller "upon trust to permit an Evangelical Lutheran Church, school-house and residence to be erected there-on." This site was only about half a kilometre south-east of the original church, but was much more accessible as the other had been isolated from both the Williamstown and Gumeracha roads by later courses. <p>Associated with the first years of settlement of the Blumberg area, the church being built on land owned by the South Australian Company (Section 6598) and leased to the early German settlers.</p> <p>The building was the first of three Lutheran churches built in Blumberg, and was used by the German community from 1850 to 1854. (It may also have functioned as a school). In this year the location of the church was removed to its present site on the Williamstown road. 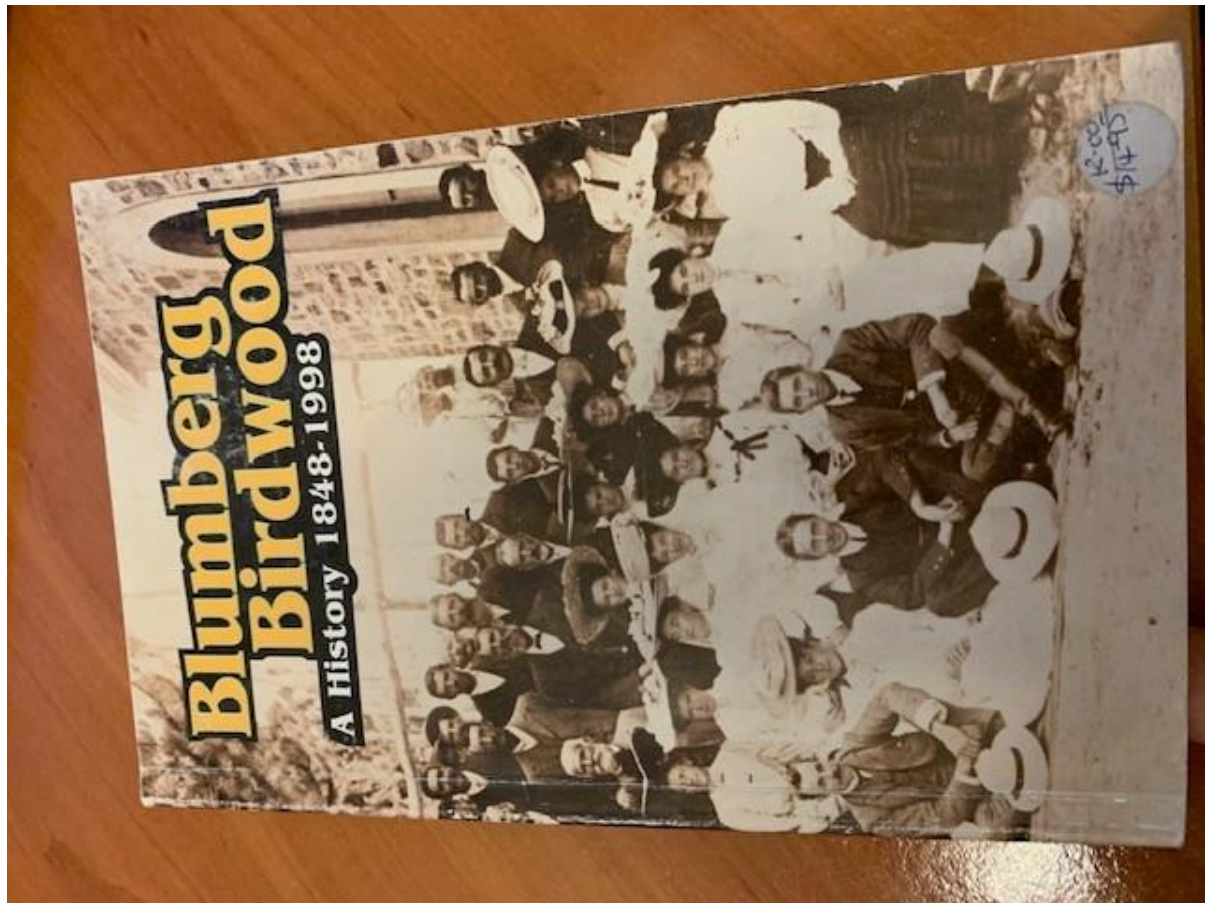

1	Location of first Lutheran Church and cemetery	B	This was built in 1850 on land owned by the S.A. Company and leased to the early German settlers. In 1854 the Church was relocated to its present site on the Williamstown Road. The cemetery which lay close to the Church was used from 1848 to 1854. The site which is now located on Mr. V. Rattjens property is very significant in the early history of the settlement of Birdwood.
2	Lutheran Church complex	A	The site was obtained from J.G. Bluemel in December, 1853, by the trustees of the Lutheran Church on which to build a Church, schoolhouse and residence. The Holy Cross Evangelical Church was built in 1860 in an ecclesiastical Gothic style. The Church house still reflects in its original portion, the German origins of the first congregation. The school house is of a simple classical design, and next to it is a late 19th Century teacher's residence. All of these buildings are pleasantly grouped in the form of a square in the centre of which is a large oak tree and a timber bell tower. The church roof has an unusual scissor frame. This is a very important complex of buildings closely related to the founding and history of Birdwood.
A	Timber Memorials, Lutheran Cemetery	A	There are two remaining timber memorials in the cemetery, one of which still has clear inscriptions. During the early phase of the State's settlement these were commonly used by all religious denominations. <u>However, very few now survive and these two examples should be carefully preserved for posterity.</u>
	Ruins of the Travellers Inn	B	This was Birdwood's first hotel built in 1853 and licensed to E. Scupin in 1854. In the same year it became the meeting place for the newly formed District Council of Talunga. It continued as such until the hotel closed in 1874. <u>The present ruins of the hotel should be retained as an historic park.</u>

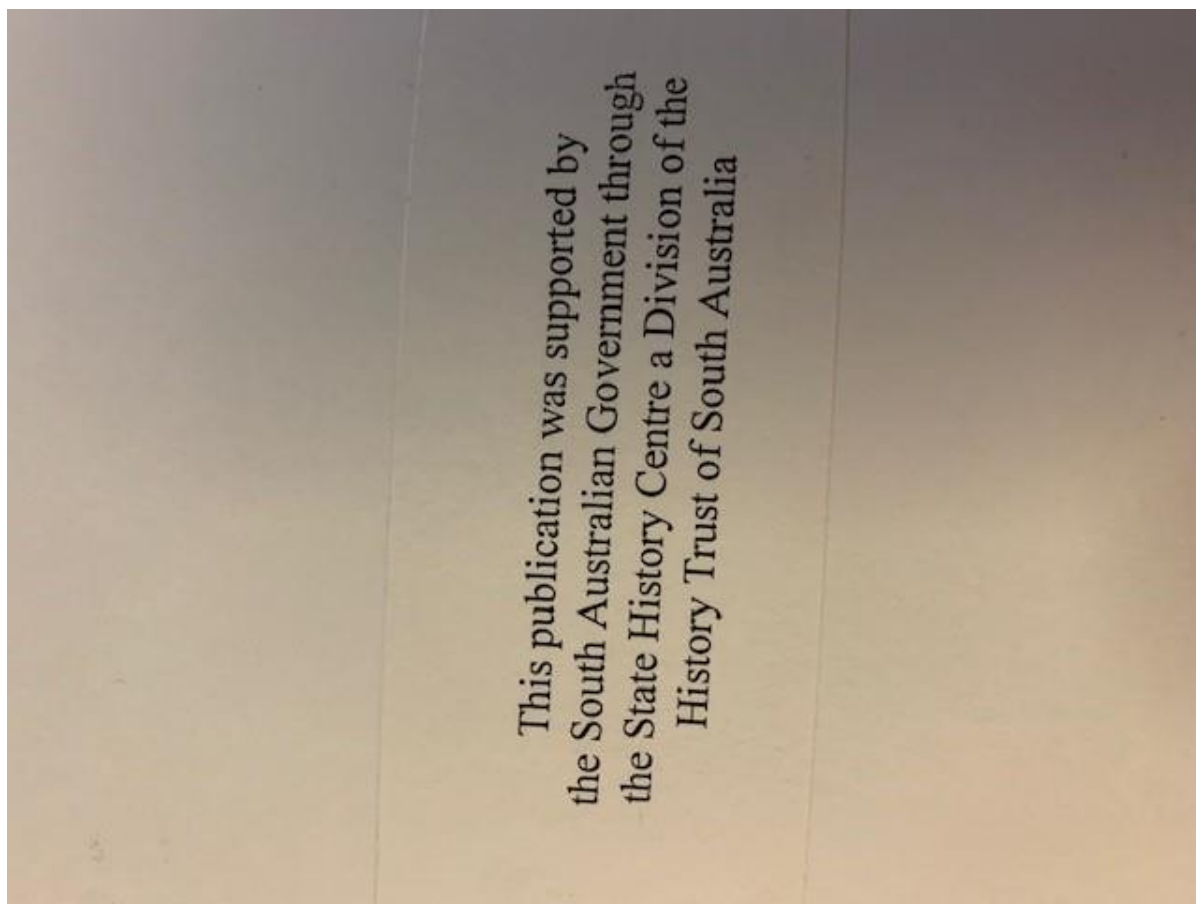
