5. Description of nominated place or object	
Description of the nominated place or object and its current condition:	A water reserve on the former main Strathalbyn to Goolwa Road which was also a designated stock route. The reserve contains a natural spring and wells that feed into hollowed out red gum log troughs to provide drinking water for livestock and also water for the former village of Sandergrove. The watercourse is recorded in Bailliere's South Australian Gazetteer as Hucy's Creek however other sources refer to it as Hughes or Hugh's Creek and in newspaper reports as Hugh's Wells.

6. Origins and history

Name of Designer / Architect:	Unknown
History of the nominated place or object:	Sandergrove Village was settled in the 1850's and in due course a Wesleyan Church, Post office and school were built. To provide water, the wells and troughs were constructed. The first record of these troughs and pipes is 1859 when a report appeared in the South Australian Register of 16 April 1859 regarding payment to James Wines for the installation of the troughs at Hugh's Wells. (Sandergrove) A later report in the Southern Argus of 20 November 1869 notes the installation of pipes and the replacing of the pipes is noted in the Southern Argus of 3 April 1884.

Newspaper reports relating to Sandergrove Water Reserve

KONDOPARINGA, FEBRUARY 12.

Present—Messrs. Barley, Kirkham, Rogers, and Hollaruby.

Letters were received from the Echunga District Council—one relative to the impounding of cattle straying over the boundaries of this and the Echunga districts; the Clerk to answer the same. Also, one relative to deviation of road running from Meadows to Echunga; a deputation of the Echunga District Council to meet one from this district to go over the ground and see parties whose land it will go through.

The Council examined certain roads in the neighbourhood of Sandergrove with a view to a deviation. Consideration deferred till next Council-day.

The Clerk to write to the Bremer District Council, requesting their co-operation in getting the present trespass road from Goldfinch's to Strathalbyn proclaimed as the boundary road between the two districts.

Mr. Hollaruby was instructed to get a piece of road cleared on the county boundary range near Mr. Hay's.

The sum of £5 to be expended in clearing the rock from road leading to Mr. Warland's. Mr. Kirkham to superintend the work.

The Clerk to forward the names of James Potter and James M. Gowan, as poundkeepers and auctioneers for this district, to the Commissioner of Public Works.

Mr. Rogers was instructed to employ a man to clear out a hole at the water-reserve at **Hugh's Wells.**

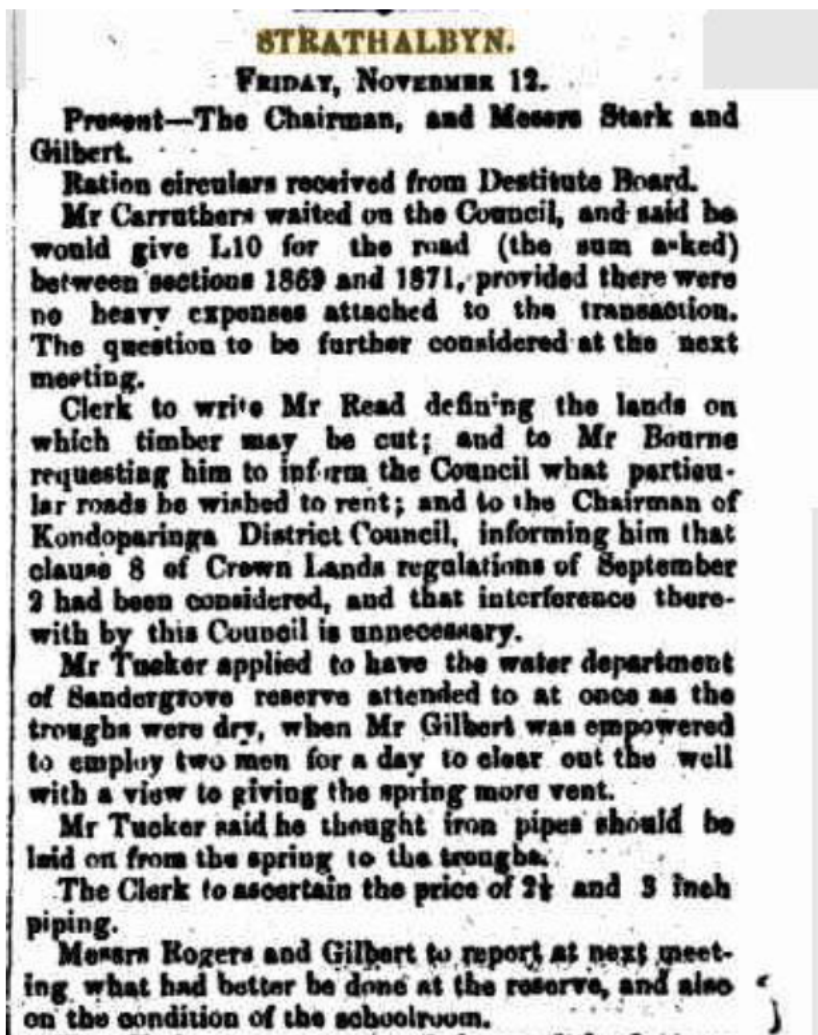
The following sums were ordered to be paid:—James Wines, for making culvert and putting in troughs at water reserve, Hugh's Wells, £5; Patrick Connell £5, for making ford and clearing road between Pais's and Lemar's, on Macclesfield-road; and James Dawson the sum of £5 for clearing road near Strathalbyn.

The Clerk was instructed to take immediate proceedings against Mr. Vickery for the recovery of the unbranded bull which he unlawfully took out of the possession of the Council.

7. Statement of State Significance - Why is the place or object important to South Australia?

It is of State heritage significance because it is a rare example of the harvesting of water for both human and stock by using local materials including hollowed out red gum logs as troughs and sections of cast iron pipes to direct the flow of water. Two brick lined wells are also present probably used by the community to draw water for domestic use.
