Murray-Darling Basin Regulated Water Charges

To improve transparency of pricing in relation to water planning and water management activities within the Murray-Darling Basin and to improve the availability of information about charges relating to water planning and water management activities, the South Australian Government has released the following information relating to Water Charges in South Australia.

Water Levy (Division 2)

The Water Levy is legislated and governed under the Landscape South Australia Act 2019 (Landscape SA Act) and is applicable to all licence holders within the South Australian proportion of the Murray-Darling Basin. The South Australian proportion of the Murray-Darling Basin covers 70 000 square kilometres with a varying landscape from the low-lying coastal plains of the Coorong to the flat expanse of the Mallee and slopes of the Eastern Mount Lofty Ranges. The management of the South Australian Murray-Darling Basin (SA MDB) as of 1 July 2020 will be divided among the three Landscape Boards established under the Landscape SA Act: the Murraylands and Riverland Landscape Board, Hills and Fleurieu Landscape Board and Northern and Yorke Landscape Board. For the current period, the Minister for Environment and Water has the legislated authority under Part 5 Division 2 section 76 of the Landscape SA Act to declare a levy or levies (a water levy or levies) payable by persons who, are the holders of any water management authorisation granted in relation to a water resource within a specified Landscape Region, or are the holders of imported water permits and/or are authorized under section 105 of the Landscape SA Act to take water from a water resource within a specified landscape management region.

The landscape boards established the following principles when setting the levy:

- user/beneficiary pays and equity
- · shared responsibility
- certainty
- resource use efficiency
- administrative efficiency
- governance (accountability, transparency, reasonable basis).

The Levy is included in landscape boards' Business Plans which are governed by the requirements of the Landscape SA Act. A landscape board is required to develop a business plan annually, and unless there is a proposal for an increase in the levy greater than CPI it can be approved by the Board, otherwise it needs to seek ministerial approval and be tabled in parliament.

The Water Levy is payable by all licence holders of water allocation and/or water access entitlements throughout the SA MDB.

For all prescribed resources a single invoice is issued to each licence holder (generally in the period between July and August) and payable within 30 days. The Department for Environment and Water subsequently pays the collected levies to the landscape board to partially fund the required priorities and projects outlined in the landscape boards' Business Plans.

The Water levy is based on the quantity of water allocated for the following prescribed water resources:

- Angas Bremer
- Mallee
- Peake, Roby and Sherlock
- Marne Saunders
- Eastern Mount Lofty Ranges

For the River Murray water resource the basis for the levy is the share of the water that makes up the relevant water resource.

The regulated charges contribute to the implementation of the the SA MDB Natural Resources Management Strategic plan, which has been adopted by the three relevant landscape boards until such time as new 5-year Landscape Plans are developed. The implementation of the existing Strategic plan is monitored with regular reporting on progress towards achievements of the goals, outcomes and targets. The Strategic plan provides comprehensive information on the management of natural resources in the SA MDB and outlines strategies and actions that will help address the many challenges facing the region's natural resources such as climate change, threats to water resources and pressures on biodiversity and productive land.

Program Delivery

Each landscape board's 2020-21 Business Plan is focused on the five priorities of the Strategic Plan. The priorities are:

- 1. Sustainable Production
- 2. Managing water resources
- 3. Biodiversity
- 4. People and Communities
- 5. Climate adaptation

The Water levies will be used (but not limited) to fully or partially fund the listed water planning and water management activities in 2020-21:

- Water resource management for the Eastern Mount Lofty Ranges, Mallee, Marne Saunders, Peake, Angus Bremer, Roby and Sherlock and River Murray prescribed resources
- Floodplain and wetland management
- Implementation of alter Affecting Activities policies
- Sustainable production on-farm support and engagement
- Monitoring and evaluation programs
- Landscape planning and research
- Community engagement in managing natural resources
- Landscape management programs
- The Board's contribution to the State Water Planning and Management costs.

The estimated costs associated with the delivery of the water planning and water management activities in the SA MDB are \$8.9 million.

For the current period, the Minister for Environment and Water has the legislated authority under the applicable sections of the Landscape SA Act to declare a nominal fee associated with the application, assessment or documentation of a licence, permit or approval fee.

On completion of the relevant application, the applicant is responsible for paying the full amount of the associated fee and ensuring that payment accompanies the application when submitted to the Department for Environment and Water.

Water Planning and Water Management activities

The Department for Environment and Water has responsibility for Water Licensing regulatory functions, customer service and metering associated with prescribed water resources and for the support, operation, maintenance and development of water licensing systems state wide.

Total operational costs for water licensing functions in South Australia will be approximately \$5.9 million for the 2019-20 financial year.
