▶ **Drones and any other remotely piloted aircraft (RPAs)**

The use of drones and other RPAs will not be permitted for commercial or personal/recreational use at the 2022 Speed Week event. This includes the whole of Lake Gairdner National Park, between Monday February 28 and Friday March 4, 2022.

Permission is required from DEW for the use of drones or other RPAs over national parks. To use a drone or RPA over a national park without a permit is in breach of the *National Parks and Wildlife (National Parks) Regulations 2016, Regulation 12(3)*.

Drones or other RPAs launched from outside the Lake Gairdner National Park boundaries are also not permitted to be flown over the Speed Week areas or over Lake Gairdner National Park.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS FOR THE USE OF LAKE GAIRDNER NATIONAL PARK DURING SPEED WEEK 2022

- The presence of Aboriginal Monitor(s) may be required on site. This will be determined on the merits of each application and the applicant will be notified and provided with further information for contact details.
- All directions given by Aboriginal monitors and DEW staff must be complied with.
- Owing to cultural sensitivities no holes are to be dug on the Lake Gairdner surface. The erection of temporary structures on the lake **is subject to** prior approval. Please include this request with details in the filming application.
- Potential environmental impacts of proposed activities will determine if an environmental impact bond will be required.
- The environmental impact bond is refundable and returned subject to the inspection of the lake surface to the satisfaction of DEW staff.
- All rubbish/waste material must be collected and removed from the park and surrounding areas and disposed of appropriately.
- Prior to driving onto the salt lake, all vehicles must be cleaned of dust or soil by use of a forced air blower or high-pressure water sprayer and cleaned again when departing the lake to remove encrusted salt. Vehicle owners are responsible for the supply of cleaning equipment and products.
- Any spills of contaminants during Speed Week must be reported ASAP to attending DEW staff or the DEW Regional Office, Port Lincoln Phone (08) 8688 3111.
- Vehicles are not permitted to access or drive onto the Lake without prior approval.
- Vehicles **must** be parked on impervious oil resistant tarpaulins to prevent oil damage to the lake surface.
- If any water is present on the lake's surface, all activities including vehicle access and filming is prohibited.
- Commercial filming activity and access to the lake is restricted to the Speed Week event area.
- All vehicle activities on the lake surface must be at least 100 metres from the lake edge to avoid visible wheel tracks and soft sections where bogging is possible.
- Weight restrictions apply to large vehicles – please include details in the filming application.
- Filming activity on the lake outside the Speed Week event area must be applied for and details included in the filming application.
- Other conditions for access to, & use of the lake and surrounding areas outside the Speed Week event area may be imposed dependent on the information provided by the applicant, Aboriginal cultural issues and environmental conditions. These conditions may be imposed by DEW, Mt Ive Station, Gawler Ranges Aboriginal Corporation (GRAC) or the Aboriginal monitor(s) as circumstances dictate.
- Access to any area of the park and the lake is not guaranteed as the Co-Management Board may, at any time, close or restrict access to any area without prior notice for fire or park management purposes.
- All vehicle access onto the lake surface must be via the only approved access point through Mt Ive Station and by arrangement with Mt Ive Station.
- If requested the applicant must supply a copy of any photos or film taken to the Co Management Board.
