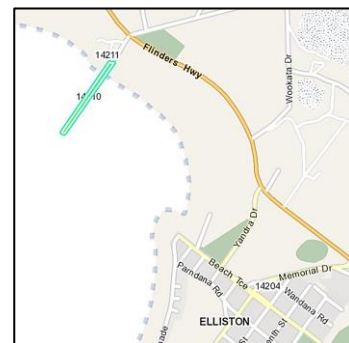
STATE HERITAGE PLACE – No. 14210

Elliston is 695 kms from Adelaide, on the Eyre Peninsula.

This is the second jetty built in Elliston, replacing an earlier one which was constructed in 1881 and damaged by a severe storm in 1896. This second jetty, built in 1900 is 427 metres long and built of timber decking on metal supports.

Dusk is the time to catch Australian herring (tommy ruffs) with squid, garfish and trevally being caught, and the jetty is lit at night with solar powered lights.

To visit you can fly or bus in to Port Lincoln or Ceduna, hire a car and drive to Elliston, or you can charter a plane as Elliston has an all-weather airstrip.
