7.1	St Alphonsus Catholic Church, 87 George Street, Millicent (On Bunganditj Country) <i>Council recommended this place for assessment through the postwar places of worship assessment list. At this meeting, the Council will consider an assessment report and determine whether it meets any of the criteria for listing under section 16 of the Heritage Places Act 1993.</i>

7.2	Elizabeth Churches (On Kaurna Country) <i>At this meeting the Council will consider a report by Heritage SA assessing Churches built in Elizabeth as a part of the New Town development between 1955 and 1966 and associated with the theme of post-war migration.</i>
7.3	5 Fitzroy Terrace, Thorngate (On Kaurna Country) <i>A member of the public nominated this place. At this meeting, the Council will consider an assessment report prepared by Heritage SA and determine whether it meets any of the criteria for listing under section 16 of the Heritage Places Act 1993.</i>

8.1	St Margaret Mary's Catholic Church, 286 Torrens Road, Croydon Park (On Kaurna country) <i>On 17 February 2022, the Council provisionally entered this place in the South Australian Heritage Register. At this meeting, the Council will determine whether to confirm it as a State Heritage Place, noting that there were no submissions received during the public consultation period.</i>
8.2	Outbuilding former Reynell's Winery and Farm Complex, 38-44 Panalatinga Road, Old Reynella (On Kaurna Country) <i>On 7 April 2022, the Council provisionally entered this place in the South Australian Heritage Register. At this meeting, the Council will consider the public submission received in the consultation period, and determine whether to confirm it as a State Heritage Place.</i>
8.3	Catholic Church of the Holy Name, 80 Payneham Road, Stepney (On Kaurna Country) <i>On 4 November 2021, the Council provisionally entered the Catholic Church of the Holy Name in the South Australian Heritage Register as a State Heritage Place. At this meeting the Council will consider the public submission received during the consultation period, and determine whether to confirm it as a State Heritage Place.</i>
8.4	Former Callington Smelting Works, 22 Callington Road, Callington (On Peramangk Country) <i>On 7 April 2022, the Council provisionally entered this place in the South Australian Heritage Register as a State Heritage Place. At this meeting the Council will consider three submissions received during the consultation period, and determine whether to confirm it as a State Heritage Place.</i>
