	6.1	Better Heritage Information – Draft Procedure  <i>A draft procedure will be provided to Council to adopt in regards to reviewing and adopting additional heritage information for State Heritage Places registered under historic legislation. This includes template letters to owners.</i>
	6.2	Aboriginal Consultation Guidelines  <i>Council will consider a Final Draft Guideline on communication and consultation with Aboriginal groups as part of its heritage listing process. This follows feedback from the State Aboriginal Heritage Committee and suggested refinements from Council members.</i>
	6.3	Annual Report 2022/2023  <i>Council will consider a draft Annual Report relating to its activities in 2022/2023. The Annual Report is due to be presented to the Minister for Climate, Environment and Water by 30 September 2023. The Minister then has 12 sitting days of Parliament to table the report.</i>

	6.4	<p>Heritage Standards for State Heritage Areas</p> <p><i>A Heritage Standard is an assessment tool, linked to the State Heritage Area Overlay within the Planning and Design Code, used to protect and manage the heritage values of State Heritage Areas. Heritage South Australia is planning to commence public consultation on four Heritage Standards in July for a 6 week period. The Council will have an opportunity to provide comment to Heritage SA as a key stakeholder.</i></p>
