

**White-browed Scrubwren**



**Superb Fairy-wren**



*(Smaller beak and body than Australian Magpie, white patches above and below eye)*

*(Dark grey body, white rump and patch on tail)*

*(Dark body, white throat, olive-cream breast streaked with black and white, feeds while climbing in a spiral motion)*

*(Large beak)*

*(Dark on top of head [crown], light stripes around eye, green patch on out-stretched wing)*
