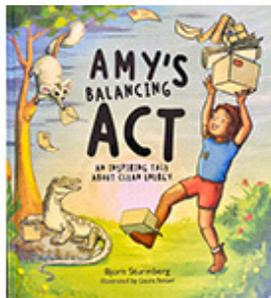




Amy's Balancing Act [Book]




Climate Change: on for young and old [Book]


Requiem for a Species: why we resist the truth about Climate Change [Book]
