
Dark emu black seeds: agriculture or accident? by Bruce Pascoe (copy 1) [Book]






The Waterbug Book (copy 1) [Book]










Rusty Loses his Loop [Book]




Australian Guide to Seashores [Book]

The unit comes with BatScan sound analysis software developed especially for the Baton. Attach the Baton to the soundcard of a laptop by a stereo lead from the 'line out' socket and you will be able to save audio files or produce real-time sonograms, allowing detailed analysis of calls in the field with the BatScan software.

The Baton is also ideal for listening to grasshoppers, crickets and other insects whose communication is in the upper part of, or above, human hearing.







Living on Floodplains [Book]

This publication is grounded in a powerful scientific insight: floodplains are as vital to rivers as bark is to trees. Without their floodplains, rivers gradually decline. While the concept is simple, its implications for managing Australia's inland rivers are far-reaching. Life in these rivers is driven largely by what happens at their edges. Just as a tree's sap flows through its outer layers, not its core, a river's vitality depends on the ebb and flow of water across its floodplain. 








Wetland Processes (copy 2) [Poster]
