

The Biodiversity Credit Exchange gives landholders access to funding to manage and protect areas of eligible native vegetation on their land in order to generate biodiversity credits.

These credits are sold to buyers that are required to offset vegetation clearances in the same region.

It's a great way for landholders to diversify their income while helping to protect the environment.

There are four simple steps



Go to the NVC website and download the **Expression of Interest** form. Submit a copy of the EOI form to EPLBAdmin@sa.gov.au



Submit a competitive bid naming the amount you would like to receive to establish and manage your site.



Field staff visit your property to assess potential credit and management options for your site.





If your bid is successful you will enter into a Heritage Agreement and receive payments to start managing the site.
