	Decision: The Murraylands and Riverland Landscape Board approved the Minutes of Meeting 6-25 held 31 July 2025.	
5.	PIRSA Update: Barb Cowey provided a verbal update: Calperum Station will be hosting 15 year 9 and 10 students for a week, mostly from Metro Adelaide, focusing on the health of the river ecology, this project is co-funded with Rotary and the Board through Grassroot grants. The Sustainable Communities project is on track for the second quarter of the financial year. Drought:  Karen Hollamby, Manager of Drought Coordination has taken a tour of the Mallee, this part of the state is still one of the worst hit by the current drought. Key take outs of the tour were:  It is extremely dry in the Northern Mallee; a report is currently being drafted. The has been significant soil drift. A hay run is being coordinated for Paruna on Friday 29 August 2025. Currently there is four drought support officer positions advertised; they will be closing Sunday 31 August 2025. Algal Bloom Fisherman across the state have been affected by declining fish sales. Travel vouchers to visit and spend time in regions affected by the algae bloom will be released in September supported by the State Government. These will be a ballot style where people are encouraged to enter and may win the vouchers. These vouchers are along the same intent as the flood tourism vouchers. There will be an Algal Bloom forum in Meningie on 9 September 2025, this is the only one for the Murraylands and Riverland Region. The new Small Business Commissioner, Dan van Holst Pellekaan, is hosting a workshop in Loxton on 18 September 2025 focusing on leadership and tourism for the Riverland. The National Small Towns conference will be held at the Kapunda Football Club on 22 to 25 September 2025. Wild Dogs: Cross Border Commissioner Kelly-Anne Saffin is happy and willing to attend meetings to discuss any issues concerning Wild Dogs.

Currently, the recommendations regarding the State Landscape Strategy review and redraft, increasing Green Adelaide's contribution to the Landscape Priorities Fund and the Landscape board, PIRSA and DEW Memorandum of Administrative Arrangement, are actively being worked on. The Deputy Premier amended the response positions on recommendations 29, 41 and 49, and provided additional comments on 24, 29, 47, 49 and 52. There was also support for further consideration and investigation, by landscape boards, on recommendations 17, 29, 31, 32, 38 and 40.</li> </ul>
