Book your cultural education session for Term 2 2023

The Northern and Yorke Landscape Board is coordinating a Nature Education program for schools in collaboration with First Nations cultural educators from Narungga and Kaurna Nations.

This program is available for schools in the council areas of Yorke Peninsula, Copper Coast, Barunga West, Northern Areas, Clare and Gilbert Valleys, Wakefield, Adelaide Plains, Light, Gawler and Barossa.

This year, we are focusing on cultural education to help link regional schools with their cultural educators, to support cultural awareness building for children and the connection of First Nations knowledge with environmental stewardship.

We have provided a list of Narungga and Kaurna cultural educators with their activities, year level and group size below.

The Northern and Yorke Landscape Board is supporting this program by providing a 50% discount off each session booked. Each school will need to contact the Northern and Yorke

Landscape Board to arrange and book a cultural educator session for Term 2 and 3, 2023. Payment will be arranged between the presenter and the school, and then we will reimburse the school for the discount.
