2. Deputations and Presentations

2.1 **Regional Water Planning – Beetaloo, Barossa and Baroota** – Jennifer Munro, Planning Officer

Beetaloo

The recent release of the Beetaloo flows into the Crystal Brook creek with before and after photographic evidence was presented. An increase in water bird life and frogs has been reported by local community members.

An evaluation report is being collated from the data collected to date, however, further funding may be required for additional evaluation. In principle support for further funding was agreed by the Board and a briefing to be presented at a future meeting.

The Board noted the commitment of SA Water to the Beetaloo release.

The monitoring of the River Red gums by Dr Anne Jensen has been carried out and further work will transpire.

2.2 **Aboriginal Engagement Committee overview** – Matt Turner, Aboriginal Partnership Officer

The Board was presented with an overview of the outcomes of the Boards Aboriginal Engagement Committee since its inception in November 2020. The committee membership comprises of representatives of the regions five Aboriginal nations and other valued stakeholders. The committee is now seeking ongoing funding to support their continuity for a further 12 months.

Action

A confirmation is required from the two RDAs and Legatus seeking their continuation to contribute funds for the Aboriginal Engagement Committee.
