3 Deputations and Presentations

3.1 L Duncan provided the Quarterly Board Projects update with a comprehensive review of the Projects being implemented since January 2025 as well as an account of the projects being wrapped up by the end of the financial year.

Adapting to Climate and Emissions (ACE) Farmer Highlights:

- On-farm Dry Times Grants: 70 Grants were funded covering a total 219 037Ha of improved land management practices, with an impressive 17 day average for farmers to receive their money into accounts
- A checklist guide to reduce emissions and increase efficiency
- podcasts completed: 'What you need to know now'
- The delivery of 21 workshops/field days
- Carbon Farming, roadside vegetation, nature repair, Australian Carbon Credit Units (ACCU) scheme Fact Sheets/booklets created
- 'Watch this space' for the Northern and Yorke Landscape board Sustainable land management survey

Some upcoming events for board member to become involved with:

Carbon Ready Ag Conference;

- this is the first conference to be held in the State. The location has been organised in Port Pirie and recognised as a region best suited to promote as many primary producers as possible to engage in practices
- E Pratt was acknowledged for the work she has committed in pulling the resources together for this event

 An Initiative by M O'Dea and N Modra. The project identified many farmers not being aware of their obligations under the Landscape Act. Successful workshops were rolled out across the region, providing a clear understanding of the legal responsibilities. Attendees are to be provided with a free chemical user training certificate after completing the session.

4 Items for Decision

4.1 Financial Analysis YTD May 2025

Operations have resulted in a higher YTD deficit for the year compared to what was forecasted. This will be offset by 4th quarter Levy income and the expected result will align with the financial year forecast of the full year deficit of \$377.4K.

The boards' cash position remains in a strong position at the end of May with no risks foreseen regarding cash management.



Most external project funding has been received as budgeted with the balance of Stronger Country and ACE Farmer invoicing expected to be completed by June 30, 2025. 	J Barwick was engaged by the Northern and Yorke Landscape Board (NYLB) in February 2024 to assist. She proceeded to research the scope and options, then approached experienced organisations, resulting in interviewing two groups to carry out the Natural Capital Approach (NCA) work for the NYLB.
	The NYLB chose IDEEA as the group to undertake the work to develop a biodiversity scorecard as a trail of the use of the NCA for our Region.
	The overview has been presented to the Landscape Board General Managers, who are supportive of the concept.
	This model has the capacity to scale to cover the other regional priorities and it is hoped that it will form the basis for our works programs and reporting in the future.
