### 4.2 *In kind support allocated to projects* – tabled

Levy support for externally funded projects 2021-2022

The federally funded projects of Marna Banggara, Living Flinders, Goyder's Line and Core Services have been reviewed to advise the Board of the in kind support attributed to each.

- Further funding for the Marna Banggara project will need to be sourced into the future. 5.6% of levy funds for 2021-2022 allocated to the project
- There are carry over funds for the Living Flinders project and 0% of levy income allocated
- Goyder's line in kind of 1.19% of levy income
- Core Services is an annual amount allocated to the Ag Ex Alliance contract, bushland conditioning monitoring and some salaries. Additional core services funds were allocated to the Marna Banggara project, resulting in an overspend.

### 4.3 Membership payments to members of the AEC

There are now two members of each First Nation group as proposed at the 31 May 2022 meeting of the Committee. This proposal was to allow for succession planning but only one vote per Nation is allowable.

It was raised a monthly fee from payroll is applied to all members receiving remuneration and this is an issue for multiple members if they are only attending sporadically.



#### Action

A briefing paper be presented at the next meeting of the Aboriginal Engagement Committee. It will advise that a carer can attend committee meetings and be remunerated for attendance if they are approved by their own boards for attendance.

Out of pocket expenses may be reimbursed for guests or carers as required and this will be added as an addendum to the Terms of Reference. Following discussions it was noted that it may need to be discussed further into the future if required.
