

# 2020-21 Annual Water Use Surveys – Mallee PWA

**Reporting annual water use by each licensee is a requirement of the Water Allocation Plan for the Mallee Prescribed Wells Area (PWA).** This survey gathers information about how people used their allocation over the water use year, and how this may change in the future. <u>This information is important for managing water resources in the region, based on changing needs of the community & climate.</u>


