Safely remove turtles from the road

As long as it is safe to do so, removing turtles from roads before they get run over is an important and easy thing to do for turtle conservation.

The 1 Million Turtles website has some good information about moving turtles found along roads, and don't forget to record your sighting on **TurtleSAT.**

Actively look for (and report) turtle nesting sites and protect nests from foxes

Nesting sites, even those which have been destroyed by foxes, should be reported using **TurtleSAT.**
