SA Drought Resilience Adoption and Innovation Hub

Kym Walton (SA Drought Resilience Adoption and Innovation Hub – Team Leader & Loxton Node Coordinator) gave an outline of the Australian Government funded SA Drought resilience adoption and innovation hub program which is a partnership between farmers, government agencies, traditional owners, industry and business. The five hub nodes have been established and the 13 drought hub projects along with 3 cross hub projects are being delivered. Key leaders in these projects are the farming systems groups.

Opportunities

- Delivery of large scale projects that add value to existing initiatives, including RDC investments
- Projects assessing the contribution native vegetation makes to drought resilience at farm and landscape scales
- · Community resilience initiative

ONE Basin CRC update (\$50 m over 10 years plus additional partners funding and in kind)

Funding of \$50m over 10 years from the Australian Government CRC Program Round 23 was approved for this bid, and in conjunction with 90 partners is the biggest project that has been pulled together on a basin level.

The One Basin CRC (1BCRC) project's vision is that Australia's irrigation regions are the most productive, resilient and sustainable in the world, and the purpose is to support communities, governments and industries and researchers to work out how Australia continues to produce what it does in a warming environment.

SA's hub is based in Loxton, covers the border to the Murray mouth.

Establishment processes are underway, and a 2 day regional hub forum is being planned for August, followed by regional advisory committees being formed before commencement of the 1BCRC programs

Work will be done under the following four programs along with the Hubs, and support from the engagement and Comms team and Admin team:

- Technology and Opportunity
- Foresight and Decisions
- Capability and commercialisation
- Education and Training

Brent Williams joined the meeting during the previous presentation.

MDBA across the region - Brent Williams (General Manager, Business Services) and Monique White (Assistant Director, Engagement, MDBA)

Multiple Regional education officer enhance MDBA and Governments understanding of local communities, and assist communities understand and respond to change brought about by water reform in the Murray-Darling Basin.

Water Storages are all full or nearly full, and expected to remain high into Spring. Prediction that we may return to La Nina later in the year, and with IOD moving to neutral, high rainfall for the Basin is predicted in winter-spring.

Water Quality – Algal blooms, Blackwater and low dissolved oxygen levels are an issue in various parts of the Basin.

Through the review the following questions will be asked

- 1. How can the Basin Plan be improved to address future challenges, including climate change?
- 2. How could the Basin Plan framework be simplified?
- 3. How do we get the best outcomes for all social, cultural, environmental and economic values?
- 4. How can the Basin Plan be improved to recognise First Nation's values in water management and enhance their involvement?

The 5 Year Financial Plan indicating current known external funding plus expected levy spends highlight the need to attract additional external funding over the coming years. Additional funding will divert some salaries and operational costs away from Levy. When flow across the SA border reaches 40GL a high river warning, given by DEW, is triggered. 13.
