Everything you need to know about the Murraylands and Riverland Young Environmental Leaders (YEL) program including program overview, dates and themes.



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Overview

The Young Environmental Leaders program provides students with opportunities to learn about their local environment and develop as leaders in their school community.

Participation in the YEL program will help students to develop skills including public speaking, while also creating a connection to and respect for the environment.

The program is free and open to students in years 5 and 6.

In 2023 forums will be held once per term in both the Murraylands and Riverland.

What's the aim?

Empower young people and ensure they have a connection with nature and their local environment so they can appreciate it into the future.

Involve as many local schools as possible and provide students with the opportunity to develop as young leaders.

Encourage the 'ripple effect' with students learning through hands-on activities and sharing back at school and with the wider school community.

Encourage students to get involved and take action within their local environment, community and at home.

Need to know:

YEL forums are open to all Murraylands and Riverland schools and caters for students in years 5-6.

The forums will be held in different locations across the region so some travel is involved.

Schools are encouraged to bring 4 students to each forum (easy for transport). You can rotate students or choose 4 to attend all forums. If you would like to bring more than 4 to a forum (eg. members of your environment group) please arrange this with your Education Officer.

Schools will need to register for each forum via the Eventbrite link to secure places.

What's involved?

Schools are invited to attend as many of the forums as possible and there is no requirement to attend all forums. Places are limited to allow for suitable group numbers at each forum.

At least one adult (teacher/SSO/mentor or parent) from each school must attend to supervise students and assist with learning and activities.

One YEL forum is hosted per term in both the Murraylands and Riverland districts, and forums run from 10:00 am-2:00 pm.

YEL forum themes for 2023:

Term 1: healthy natural landscapes

Term 2: sustainable farming

Term 3: sustainable water use

Term 4: healthy rivers and wetlands

Forums are based on the themes and include hands-on activities and personal skills development for all involved.

Participants should bring morning tea and lunch to each forum. The education team provides tea and coffee for teachers/adults and water to refill bottles.





Benefits

The YEL program provides many benefits to the students, teachers and mentors who attend. Here are just a few:

Students

Develop a connection to the natural environment resulting in smarter, healthier and happier kids who are more mindful of their surroundings.

Develop confidence and skills in leadership, public speaking, peer teaching and more.

Build friendships and share ideas with students from other schools.

Develop knowledge and skills in caring for and conserving our local landscapes.

Be inspired and empowered to take action and make changes in their local community and at home.

Be rewarded for their efforts in learning and sharing throughout the year.



Teachers/mentors

Receive information to assist with lessons, resources, activities and curriculum links to share at school.

Have the opportunity to network with and learn from other teachers and professionals.

Develop knowledge and skills in caring for and conserving our local landscapes.

May receive professional development recognition for the forums they attend.



Schools and community

Direct links to the curriculum-these are not add-on projects! This is learning in authentic context.

Develop relationships with community members, partnership schools, outside organisations and the education program.

YEL students pass on knowledge, skills and what they have learnt to peers, friends and family members.

Improved sustainability due to studentled projects e.g. improved biodiversity or waste reduction.

Where possible the education team will provide in-school support for learning and on-ground projects.





2023 YEL information pack Curriculum

Information and activities used at YEL forums can be linked to many subject areas in the curriculum, particularly science, HASS, geography, health and physical education, and even maths.

YEL activities tie in well with science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM). Environmental issues are often challenging, requiring complex solutions and the education team encourage hands-on practical activities that help learners experiment, use new technologies, test ideas and create innovative solutions to real problems.

Relationships with local industries and communities are also important to both teacher and student learning in both STEM and sustainability. YEL helps develop these relationships with guest speakers and linking with existing projects.

Examples of links with the Australian Curriculum

Students explain interconnections between people and places and people and environments, describing how these interconnections change places and environments. (HASS)

Students examine how connecting to the environment can enhance health and wellbeing. (HPE)

Students predict the effect of human and environmental changes on interactions between organisms. (Science)

Students describe and predict the effect of environmental changes on individual living things. (Science)

Links to general capabilities

Literacy skills are developed by students presenting ideas and opinions, through sharing their learning back at school and

Critical and creative thinking is developed when students consider environmental issues and propose solutions.

Personal and social capability is developed through interacting with students from developing leadership skills.

Ethical understanding is developed by students engaging and discussing the ethical values of environmental issues such as

The YEL program links well with the cross-curriculum priority of sustainability.

YEL forums help students to develop the knowledge, skills, values and world views necessary to act in ways that contribute to more sustainable patterns of living.

Students focus on protecting environments and creating a more ecologically and socially just world through informed action.





Forums

In 2023, a YEL forum will be held in both the Riverland and Murraylands each term. A registration link and location information will be emailed to schools at least 3 weeks prior to each forum. Students and teachers will need to register for each forum via the Eventbrite link to secure places.

What to bring to each forum: all attendees need to bring a packed recess, lunch and refillable water bottle (tea,coffee and snacks will be provided for adults where possible). Camera/ipad for photos. Wear suitable clothing for the day. Hats and enclosed shoes are a must at all YEL forums and long pants will be required at some locations.





2023 YEL information pack Requirements

It is not a requirement or expectation that schools attend all YEL forums, or that the same students come to each forum. The content and activity at each forum will be tailored so that anyone who attends will learn and take away valuable knowledge and skills.

To maximise the outcomes for participants, students and adult supervisors are encouraged to participate to the best of their ability. Here are some hints and tips to help you gain the most out of your YEL experience:

Students

Actively participate in activities and presentations during the forum.

Will be encouraged to share information at school based on the skills learnt.

Will have the opportunity to earn rewards for sharing what they learnt back at school.

Throughout the year, think about their connection with their local landscapes and what they can do to make change and live more sustainably.

Will have the opportunity to meet and mingle with students from other schools from across the region.

Schools

Provide time/resourcing for teacher/SSO/mentor to attend YEL forums with students and support the sharing of information back at school.

Support students in YEL participation and to share the learnings and new leadership/public speaking skills at school via peer teaching/sharing or presentations.

Promote the excellent work of the YEL students throughout the school community.

Teachers/mentors

Register your interest to ensure you receive forum information (simply email cindy. kakoschke@sa.gov.au to be included on the YEL email list).

Select students to attend the forums. If you have a school environment group please consider rotating students. If you would like to bring more than 4 students to a forum please let your Education Officer know but note that places may be limited depending on location.

Register your school and students via the Eventbrite link for each YEL forum. The details and links will be sent to each school at least 3 weeks prior to the event.

Ensure that each student has completed and returned a signed photo release form prior to attending forum.

Transport students and supervise them at the forum.

Provide support to the students at school so they are able to sharing what they have learnt.

Share resources, activities and information with fellow teachers at a staff meeting after the forum.





2023 YEL information pack **Sharing at school**

After a YEL forum, students are encouraged to share their knowledge and skills at school. Sharing their knowledge with their peers is one of the ways the YEL program is so effective. Whether it be presenting to the school assembly or running an activity with a group of students, there are many ways to share, create the ripple effect and ensure the excitement and information flows through the whole school community.

When students commit to sharing their knowledge at school, they are rewarded for their effort. Once information or activities have been shared, students will need to explain what they have done in order to receive their reward(s). Report cards can be used OR an email with photos or copies of their work can also be shared with your Education Officer.

This year we will be offering a prize pack for the YEL school who shares the most information back at school (for one Riverland school and one Murraylands school).

News reward

Students are encouraged to write a newsletter article or update on what they have learnt and achieved at the YEL forum.





Presentation reward

Students will participate in activities to help improve public speaking skills and identifying what makes a good presentation.


At school, students are encouraged to make their own presentation about the YEL forum topic and deliver it to their class or at assembly.



Kids teaching kids reward

Students will learn skills to assist them in delivering an activity or lesson about the forum topic to their peers or younger students back at school.

Students are encouraged to teach their peers as well as younger students at school about what they have learnt or experienced.



Action reward

At the forums students will learn about how to take action back at school or home and will be given simple ideas, resources and tools to help.

Any efforts towards taking action for the environment at school or home will be rewarded.







2023 YEL information pack **Sharing at school**

In 2023, student rewards for sharing back at school will be given out in the form of coloured beads. Each student will receive a YEL keyring/bag tag to add their coloured beads to, creating a keepsake that reminds them of their experiences.

















2023 YEL information pack Risk assessment

Excursion risk assessment and safety of students is the responsibility of the school and adults in attendance. A simple/generic risk assessment of each YEL event will be provided to registered schools and can be used as the basis for more detailed requirements at school.

Below is an example page from the 3 page basic risk assessment from a YEL event from 2022.

2023 YEL program Registration

Registering to be part of the YEL program ensures you will receive information about future YEL forums in your area.

An event registration link, flyer and location information will be emailed to you at least 3 weeks prior to each forum. Teachers will need to register students for each forum via the Eventbrite link for each separate forum to secure a place and this provides us with our attendance list for the day.

Teachers will also need to ensure each student and adult attending a forum brings a signed photo consent form (see page 12-13). You can provide these now if you know who your YEL students will be.
