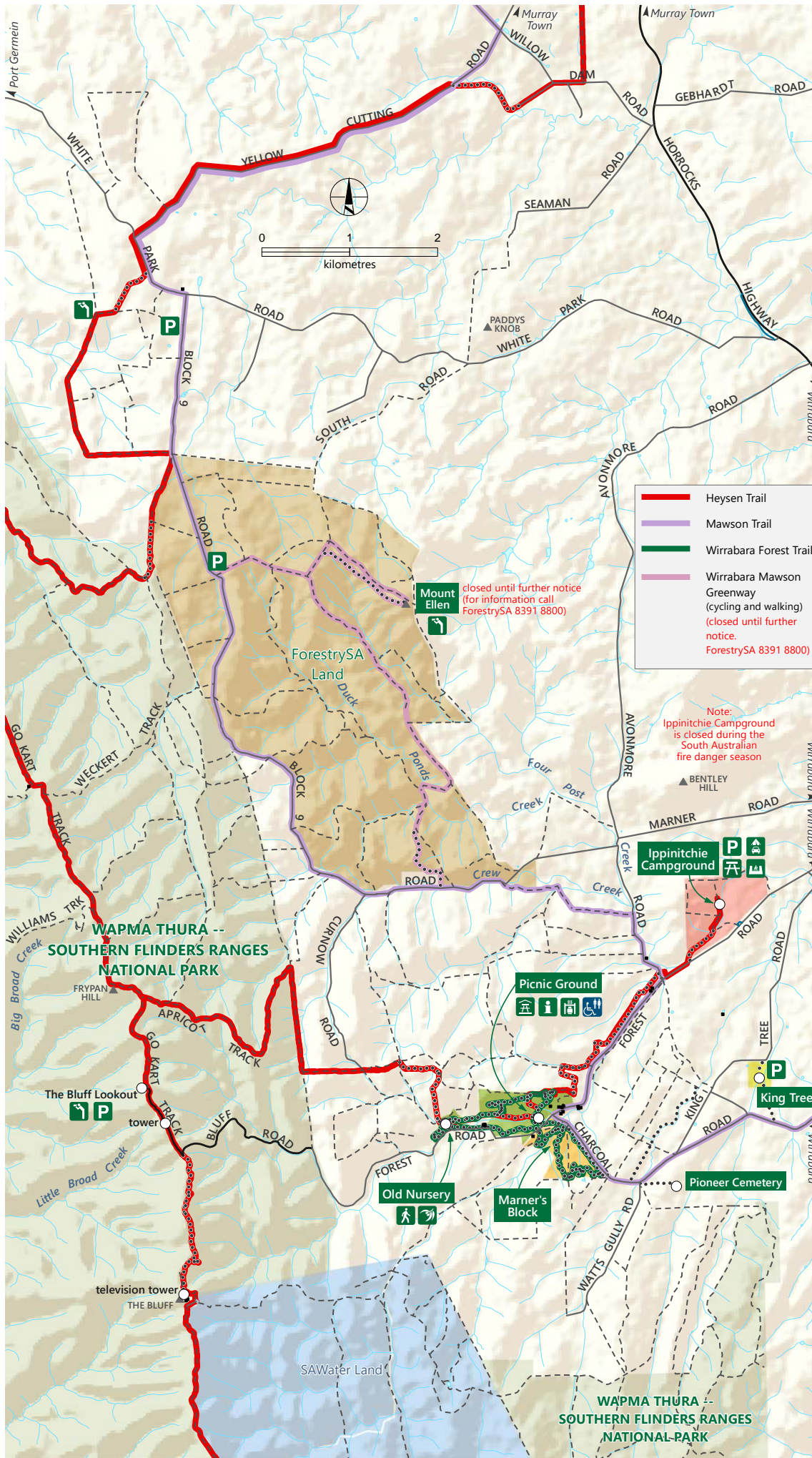

Former ForestrySA trails

The land formerly managed by ForestrySA as the Wirrabara Forest has been transferred to private ownership. The trail network which passed through these areas is no longer in place. Access has been maintained as part of the Mawson and Heysen Trails through areas of public land and also through private landholdings.

Heysen and Mawson Trails

During the South Australian fire danger season (usually December 1 to April 30), sections of the Heysen Trail are closed. In addition, sections of the trail that go through conservation parks and forests are closed on broadcast fire ban days. The Mawson Trail is open all year round, however the months of January to March can be fiercely hot and are best avoided.

Wapma Thura - Southern Flinders Ranges National Park

There are no visitor facilities within this reserve. The public can access this area via walking trails. The reserve has a network of fire tracks, however there is no public vehicle access within this area.
