West Terrace, which opened in 1920, and there is a strong link between the two sites. The Keswick Hospital demonstrates important aspects of the history of military and repatriation medicine in South Australia.

The State Library holds many photographs of the Keswick Hospital in series B26285 and other series. It was also known as the "Diggers' Hospital" and "Repatriation General Hospital" during the interwar period and during the Second World War. It was superseded as a repatriation hospital by the hospital at Daw Park now known as "The Repat" in 1946, but an outpatients department continued to operate at Keswick until 1968.

There are several other buildings which are potentially of significant heritage value, including the detention barracks along Keswick Creek on the southern edge of the site. This was the principal detention barracks for soldiers convicted of serious military offences during the Second World War, and for a significant period of its use during the war the regimental sergeant major of the detention barracks was South Australian First World War Victoria Cross recipient Roy Inwood of the Military Prison and Detention Barracks Service. It is believed to be the only existing Second World War military detention barracks in the state, and is in fair condition. It is qualitatively distinct from the internee and POW cell block at Loveday, which was not used to hold Australian soldiers, and the cell block at Terowie which was only for short-term detention related to the nearby staging camp. The Keswick detention barracks demonstrates aspects of the history of military law and justice in South Australia.

It is of State heritage significance because some of the buildings within the barracks demonstrate important aspects of the military, military medical/repatriation and military justice history of SA, and have a strong connection to the veteran community and the families of those who have served, particularly those whose family members served in the First World War and were wounded.

The response to the large numbers of casualties among South Australians in the First World War, the post-war deaths of wounded, the repatriation system between the wars. Also the history of military law and justice in the state through the detention barracks.

Cell blocks at other locations were not used for the same purposes, and certainly not for the length of sentences that applied at the Keswick detention barracks.

×	It is an outstanding representative of a particular class of places of cultural significance.	As the principal military hospital in the state during the world wars and the interwar period, the Keswick Hospital buildings are the only remaining examples in the state of a military hospital from this important period. The connection that many veterans and their families felt and continue to feel with the site is significant, along with its strong connection to the AIF Cemetery at West Terrace where hundreds of those who died at Keswick Hospital are buried.		
	It demonstrates a high degree of creative, aesthetic or technical accomplishment or is an outstanding representative of particular construction techniques or design characteristics.			
	It has strong cultural or spiritual associations for the community or a group within it.	Keswick Barracks and its buildings have a strong association with the veteran and wider community of the state with connections to service in th two world wars. Some buildings are not of heritage significance, but there are many which should be examined to properly assess their significance.

It has a special association with the life or work of a person or organisation or an event of historical importance.

As the oldest remaining military barracks in the state, Keswick Barracks has a very special association with the service of South Australians in both world wars, during which over 8,000 died and many thousands more were wounded. Many of those who were wounded were treated at the Keswick Hospital during its time as a military then repatriation hospital between 1915 and 1946.
